inauspicious Unlucky.

This is the **inauspicious** star of disaster.

inimical Tending to obstruct or harm.

An inimical alien power.

Believing the worst of human nature and motives; having a sneering

misanthropic disbelief in e.g. selflessness of others.

A **misanthropic** drunken loner.

negative Having a negative charge.

A **negative** outlook on life.

uncongenial Not suitable to your tastes or needs.

The task was **uncongenial** to one sensitive to rebuffs.

unfavourable Likely to lead to an adverse outcome.

Single mothers are often the target of **unfavourable** press attention.

Not propitious.

unpropitiousHis reports were submitted at a financially **unpropitious** time.
