injurious Causing or likely to cause damage or harm.

Food which is **injurious** to health.

insalubrious (of a place) seedy and run-down; unwholesome.

malign Having or exerting a malignant influence.

morbid Suggesting an unhealthy mental state.

noxious Injurious to physical or mental health.

**out of condition** Directed outward or serving to direct something outward.



**out of shape** Not allowed to continue to bat or run.

**peaky**Having or as if having especially high-pitched spots.

poisonous

Having the qualities or effects of a poison.

There was a **poisonous** atmosphere at the office.

Somewhat ill or prone to illness.

poorly Feeling poorly.

ruinous In ruins; dilapidated.

A **ruinous** effect on the environment.

sick (of an emotion) so intense as to cause one to feel unwell or nauseous.

He was **sick** for a sight of her.

sickly (of a place or climate) causing or characterized by unhealthiness.

A **sickly** vaporous swamp.

**twisted** Forced out of its natural or proper shape; crumpled.

valetudinarian Of or relating to or characteristic of a person who is a valetudinarian.

Relating to or denoting the weakest of the known kinds of force between particles which acts only at distances less than about 10 cm is very much weaker than the electromagnetic and the strong interactions and conserves neither strangeness parity nor isospin.
