- *Not previously known of or done.*
- *Not heard or listened to.*
- *Not necessarily inaudible but not heard.*

<b>exceptional</b>	Unusual; not typical. <i>Special educational provisions for <b>exceptional</b> children.</i>
<b>extraordinary</b>	Unusually great. <i><b>Extraordinary</b> authority.</i>
<b><a href="#">groundbreaking</a></b>	Innovative; pioneering. <i><b>Groundbreaking</b> research into fertility problems.</i>
<b>little known</b>	Small in a way that arouses feelings (of tenderness or its opposite depending on the context).

<b>nameless</b>	(of a child) illegitimate. <i>A <b>nameless</b> yearning for transcendence.</i>
<b>new</b>	Gratuitously new. <i><b>New</b> potatoes.</i>
<b>obscure</b>	Not clearly expressed or easily understood. <i>An <b>obscure</b> village.</i>
<b>out of earshot</b>	Outer or outlying.
<b>out of the ordinary</b>	Outer or outlying.
<b>singular</b>	Relating to or of the nature of singularity. <i>Such poise is <b>singular</b> in one so young.</i>
<b>uncommon</b>	Marked by an uncommon quality especially superlative or extreme of its kind. <i>Doing an <b>uncommon</b> amount of business.</i>
<b>undiscovered</b>	Not yet discovered. <i>With earth based telescopes many stars remain <b>undiscovered</b>.</i>
<b>unequaled</b>	Superior to all others in performance or extent. <i>A range of facilities <b>unequaled</b> in London.</i>
<b>unfamiliar</b>	Not known or recognized. <i>The yellow taxicab was an <b>unfamiliar</b> sight on these roads.</i>
<b>unheralded</b>	Without warning or announcement. <i>He was unwilling to make an <b>unheralded</b> entrance.</i>
<b>unique</b>	(followed by `to') applying exclusively to a given category or condition or locality. <i>Certain types of problems have <b>unique</b> solutions.</i>
<b>unknown</b>	Being or having an unknown or unnamed source. <i><b>Unknown</b> artists of the avant garde.</i>
<b>unmatched</b>	Of the remaining member of a pair. <i>Infamy <b>unmatched</b> in the Western world.</i>
<b>unparalleled</b>	Radically distinctive and without equal. <i>A breakdown of law <b>unparalleled</b> in our history.</i>
<b>unprecedented</b>	Having no precedent; novel. <i>An <b>unprecedented</b> expansion in population and industry.</i>
<b>unrivalled</b>	Eminent beyond or above comparison. <i>The paper's coverage of foreign news is <b>unrivalled</b>.</i>
<b>unsung</b>	Not celebrated or praised. <i><b>Unsung</b> heroes of the war.</i>

**unusual**

Being definitely out of the ordinary and unexpected; slightly odd or even a bit weird.

*The government has taken the **unusual** step of calling home its ambassador.*
