| unfamiliar | Not known or recognized. <i>The yellow taxicab was an unfamiliar sight on these roads.</i> |
| unheralded | Without warning or announcement. <i>He was unwilling to make an unheralded entrance.</i> |
| unique | (followed by `to') applying exclusively to a given category or condition or locality. <i>Certain types of problems have unique solutions.</i> |
| unknown | Being or having an unknown or unnamed source. <i>Unknown artists of the avant garde.</i> |
| unmatched | Of the remaining member of a pair. <i>Infamy unmatched in the Western world.</i> |
| unparalleled | Radically distinctive and without equal. <i>A breakdown of law unparalleled in our history.</i> |
| unprecedented | Having no precedent; novel. <i>An unprecedented expansion in population and industry.</i> |
| unrivalled | Eminent beyond or above comparison. <i>The paper's coverage of foreign news is unrivalled.</i> |
| unsung | Not celebrated or praised. <i>Unsung heroes of the war.</i> |

unusual

Being definitely out of the ordinary and unexpected; slightly odd or even a bit weird.

*The government has taken the **unusual** step of calling home its ambassador.*
