- Having committed unrighteous acts.
- Not hallowed or consecrated.
- Extremely evil or cruel; expressive of cruelty or befitting hell.
- Sinful; wicked.

Diabolical sorcerers under the influence of devils.

discordant (of sounds) harsh and jarring because of a lack of harmony.

The singers continued their **discordant** chanting.

Causing or involving great suffering, fear, or unhappiness; extremely bad or

<u>dreadful</u> serious.

Don t go out the weather is **dreadful**.

Extremely awkward or complex.

Fiendish methods of torture.

frightful Provoking horror.

A **frightful** mistake.

godless Not revering god.

Humanity coming to terms with a **godless** world.

heathen Relating to heathens. **Heathen** practices.

Of or like hell.

hellish Hellish torture.

horrendous Extremely unpleasant, horrifying, or terrible.

Horrendous explosions shook the city.

horrific Causing horror.

Horrific conditions in the mining industry.

Causing horror; extremely shocking.

horrifyingA horrifying incident.

impious Lacking due respect or dutifulness.

Impious toward one s parents.

improbable Too improbable to admit of belief.

The characters have **improbable** names.

incompatible (of two people) unable to live together harmoniously.

Long hours are simply **incompatible** with family life.

infernal Expletives used informally as intensifiers.

Infernal regions.



irreligious Hostile or indifferent to religion.

An **irreligious** man.

irreverent Characterized by a lightly pert and exuberant quality.

She is **irreverent** about the whole business of politics.

outrageous Very bold and unusual and rather shocking.

Subjected to **outrageous** cruelty.

Relating to pagans or their beliefs.

A **pagan** god.

Characterized by profanity or cursing.

A **profane** person might be tempted to violate the tomb.

Involving or committing sacrilege.

sacrilegious A sacrilegious act.

. . Of or relating to Satan.

satanic A satanic cult.

Very bad.

shocking Shocking behaviour.

Far more than usual or expected.

sinful A sinful way of life.

terrible Exceptionally bad or displeasing.

The weather was **terrible**.

ungodly Characterized by iniquity; wicked because it is believed to be a sin.

I ve been troubled by telephone calls at **ungodly** hours.

unhallowed Not formally consecrated.

Unhallowed ground.

unnatural Not normal; not typical or usual or regular or conforming to a norm.

An **unnatural** death.

unusual Not habitually or commonly occurring or done.

A man of **unusual** talent.

wicked Extremely unpleasant.

Despite the sun the wind outside was **wicked**.

Usage Examples of "Unholy" as an adjective

• She was making an unholy racket.

• A father killing his son is an act against nature—unholy and loathsome.

• An unholy alliance between the medical profession and the pharmaceutical industry.
