- *Used to emphasize how bad something is; dreadful.*
- *Having committed unrighteous acts.*
- *Not hallowed or consecrated.*
- *Extremely evil or cruel; expressive of cruelty or befitting hell.*
- *Sinful; wicked.*

Synonyms of "Unholy" as an adjective (35 Words)

appalling	Causing shock or dismay; horrific. <i>His conduct was appalling.</i>
atheistic	Rejecting any belief in gods. <i>Atheistic scientists.</i>

<u>blasphemous</u>	Grossly irreverent toward what is held to be sacred. Blasphemous rites of a witches Sabbath.
<u>demonic</u>	Relating to or characteristic of demons or evil spirits. A demonic hurry.
<u>diabolic</u>	Showing the cunning or ingenuity or wickedness typical of a devil. Fires lit up a diabolic scene.
<u>diabolical</u>	Showing the cunning or ingenuity or wickedness typical of a devil. Diabolical sorcerers under the influence of devils.
<u>discordant</u>	(of sounds) harsh and jarring because of a lack of harmony. The singers continued their discordant chanting.
<u>dreadful</u>	Causing or involving great suffering, fear, or unhappiness; extremely bad or serious. Don't go out the weather is dreadful .
<u>fiendish</u>	Extremely awkward or complex. Fiendish methods of torture.
<u>frightful</u>	Provoking horror. A frightful mistake.
<u>godless</u>	Not revering god. Humanity coming to terms with a godless world.
<u>heathen</u>	Relating to heathens. Heathen practices.
<u>hellish</u>	Of or like hell. Hellish torture.
<u>horrendous</u>	Extremely unpleasant, horrifying, or terrible. Horrendous explosions shook the city.
<u>horrific</u>	Causing horror. Horrific conditions in the mining industry.
<u>horrifying</u>	Causing horror; extremely shocking. A horrifying incident.
<u>impious</u>	Lacking due respect or dutifulness. Impious toward one's parents.
<u>improbable</u>	Too improbable to admit of belief. The characters have improbable names.
<u>incompatible</u>	(of two people) unable to live together harmoniously. Long hours are simply incompatible with family life.
<u>infernal</u>	Expletives used informally as intensifiers. Infernal regions.

irreligious	Hostile or indifferent to religion. <i>An irreligious man.</i>
irreverent	Characterized by a lightly pert and exuberant quality. <i>She is irreverent about the whole business of politics.</i>
outrageous	Very bold and unusual and rather shocking. <i>Subjected to outrageous cruelty.</i>
pagan	Relating to pagans or their beliefs. <i>A pagan god.</i>
profane	Characterized by profanity or cursing. <i>A profane person might be tempted to violate the tomb.</i>
sacrilegious	Involving or committing sacrilege. <i>A sacrilegious act.</i>
satanic	Of or relating to Satan. <i>A satanic cult.</i>
shocking	Very bad. <i>Shocking behaviour.</i>
sinful	Far more than usual or expected. <i>A sinful way of life.</i>
terrible	Exceptionally bad or displeasing. <i>The weather was terrible.</i>
ungodly	Characterized by iniquity; wicked because it is believed to be a sin. <i>I've been troubled by telephone calls at ungodly hours.</i>
unhallowed	Not formally consecrated. <i>Unhallowed ground.</i>
unnatural	Not normal; not typical or usual or regular or conforming to a norm. <i>An unnatural death.</i>
unusual	Not habitually or commonly occurring or done. <i>A man of unusual talent.</i>
wicked	Extremely unpleasant. <i>Despite the sun the wind outside was wicked.</i>

Usage Examples of "Unholy" as an adjective

- *Unholy grimaces.*
- *She was making an unholy racket.*
- *A father killing his son is an act against nature—unholy and loathsome.*
- *An unholy alliance between the medical profession and the pharmaceutical industry.*
