## Associations of "Unidentifiable" (30 Words)

<b>anonymous</b>	Having no outstanding, individual, or unusual features; unremarkable or impersonal. <i><b>Anonymous</b> donors.</i>
<b>blind</b>	Make blind by putting the eyes out. <i>The criminals were punished and <b>blinded</b>.</i>
<b>enigmatic</b>	Difficult to interpret or understand; mysterious. <i>I didn't grasp the meaning of that <b>enigmatic</b> comment until much later.</i>
<b>grotesque</b>	Art characterized by an incongruous mixture of parts of humans and animals interwoven with plants. <i>Tales of <b>grotesque</b> serpents eight fathoms long that churned the seas.</i>
<b>hidden</b>	Difficult to find. <i><b>Hidden</b> valleys.</i>

<b>inglorious</b>	Not famous or renowned. <i><b>Inglorious</b> defeat.</i>
<b><u>involuntary</u></b>	Controlled by the autonomic nervous system; without conscious control. <i>She gave an <b>involuntary</b> shudder.</i>
<b>nameless</b>	Deliberately not identified; anonymous. <i>Corporations responsible to <b>nameless</b> owners.</i>
<b><u>obscure</u></b>	Make obscure or unclear. <i>Those who do not appreciate Kafka's work say his style is <b>obscure</b>.</i>
<b><u>occult</u></b>	Supernatural forces and events and beings collectively. <i>A secret society to study alchemy and the <b>occult</b>.</i>
<b>outlandish</b>	Conspicuously or grossly unconventional or unusual. <i>Three wise <b>outlandish</b> kings.</i>
<b><u>pseudonym</u></b>	A fictitious name, especially one used by an author. <i>I wrote under the <b>pseudonym</b> of Evelyn Hervey.</i>
<b>secret</b>	Of information given in confidence or in secret. <i>Their <b>secret</b> communications.</i>
<b><u>shameful</u></b>	Deserving or bringing disgrace or shame- Rachel Carson. <i>A <b>shameful</b> accusation.</i>
<b>sneaker</b>	Someone acting as an informer or decoy for the police.
<b>strange</b>	Denoting or involving a flavour (variety) of unstable quark having an electric charge of $-1/3$ . Strange quarks have similar properties to down quarks and bottom quarks, but are distinguished from them by having an intermediate mass. <i>Her head still felt <b>strange</b>.</i>
<b><u>unappreciated</u></b>	Having value that is not acknowledged. <i>She had been brought up in a family where she felt <b>unappreciated</b> and undervalued.</i>
<b><u>unaware</u></b>	Having no knowledge of a situation or fact. <i>Seemed <b>unaware</b> of the scrutiny.</i>
<b><u>undetected</u></b>	Not detected or discovered. <i>The thieves escaped <b>undetected</b>.</i>
<b>undiagnosed</b>	Eluding diagnosis. <i><b>Undiagnosed</b> disease.</i>
<b><u>undiscovered</u></b>	Not discovered. <i>The novel had lain <b>undiscovered</b> for years among his papers.</i>
<b><u>unfamiliar</u></b>	Not known or recognized. <i>He felt a stranger among the crowd of <b>unfamiliar</b> faces.</i>

- uninitiated** Not initiated; deficient in relevant experience.  
*It seemed a bizarre ceremony to **uninitiated** western eyes.*
- unintentional** Done or made or performed with purpose and intent.  
*The translation added a layer of **unintentional** comedy.*
- unintentionally** Without intention; in an unintentional manner.  
*She hit him **unintentionally**.*
- unknown** An unknown and unexplored region.  
*They came like angels out the **unknown**.*
- unnamed** Being or having an unknown or unnamed source.  
*An **unnamed** donor.*
- unsung** Not celebrated or praised.  
*Harvey is one of the **unsung** heroes of the industrial revolution.*
- whereabouts** The general location where something is.  
***Whereabouts** do you come from.*
