<u>attire</u>	Clothing of a distinctive style or for a particular occasion. <i>The usually sober attire of British security service personnel.</i>
<u>costume</u>	A swimming costume. <i>He was in charge of costumes and scenery for plays and masques.</i>
<u>dress</u>	Clothing of a distinctive style or for a particular occasion. <i>Traditional African dress.</i>
<u>ensemble</u>	The coordination between performers executing an ensemble passage. <i>Cherubini's numbers with solos and ensembles intermingled have a freedom and originality.</i>
garb	Clothing, especially of a distinctive or special kind. <i>Kids in combat garb.</i>

<u>outfit</u>	A group of people undertaking a particular activity together, especially a group of musicians, a team, or a business concern. <i>A first aid outfit.</i>
regalia	The emblems or insignia of royalty, especially the crown, sceptre, and other ornaments used at a coronation. <i>The Bishop of Florence in full regalia.</i>
suit	A businessman dressed in a business suit. <i>They buried him in his best suit.</i>

indistinguishable	Not capable of being distinguished or differentiated. <i>The twins were indistinguishable.</i>
invariable	(of a quantity) constant. <i>His invariable courtesy.</i>
matching	Intentionally matched. <i>The college will provide matching funds to complete the project.</i>
<u>monotonous</u>	Sounded or spoken in a tone unvarying in pitch. <i>The owl s faint monotonous hooting.</i>
regular	Regularly scheduled for fixed times. <i>Plant the flags at regular intervals.</i>
similar	Resembling or similar having the same or some of the same characteristics often used in combination. <i>Similar food at similar prices.</i>
<u>stable</u>	Sane and sensible; not easily upset or disturbed. <i>Specially designed dinghies that are very stable.</i>
<u>static</u>	Concerned with or producing or caused by static electricity. <i>The whole ballet appeared too static.</i>
<u>steady</u>	Not subject to change or variation especially in behavior. <i>A solid steady young man.</i>
sustained	Continuing for an extended period or without interruption. <i>Sustained flight.</i>
the same	Unchanged in character or nature.

twin

Of a crystal twinned.
Her **twin** sister.

unchanging

Conforming to the same principles or course of action over time.
The party stood for **unchanging** principles.

undeviating

Showing no deviation; constant and steady.
The **undeviating** loyalty of his wife.

undifferentiated

Not different or differentiated.
By six weeks the sexual glands are as yet **undifferentiated** between male and female.

unfluctuating

Not liable to fluctuate or especially to fall.

unvaried

Lacking variety.
A plain **unvaried** diet.

unvarying

Unvarying in nature.
The **unvarying** routine of parsonage life.

unwavering

Not showing abrupt variations- Louis Auchincloss.
Unwavering loyalty.

clad	Covered with cladding. <i>White clad nurses.</i>
clothed	Covered with or as if with clothes or a wrap or cloak. <i>Leaf clothed trees.</i>
clothes	Bedclothes. <i>Rosie got into bed and pulled the clothes up to her nose.</i>
clothing	Clothes collectively. <i>Bring warm clothing and waterproofs.</i>
corset	Dress with a corset.
<u>dress</u>	Add a dressing to a salad. <i>He dressed up in a suit and tie.</i>
<u>dressed</u>	Dressed or clothed especially in fine attire often used in combination. <i>Serve with dressed salad leaves.</i>
footwear	Covering for a person's feet.
gown	Put on a surgical gown. <i>The relations between town and gown are always sensitive.</i>
hosiery	Stockings, socks, and tights collectively.
hussar	A soldier in a light cavalry regiment which had adopted a dress uniform modelled on that of the Hungarian hussars now only in titles. <i>The Queen's Royal Irish Hussars.</i>
invariable	(of a quantity) constant. <i>An invariable temperature.</i>
jean	Close-fitting trousers of heavy denim for manual work or casual wear. <i>A jean jacket.</i>
legging	A garment covering the leg (usually extending from the knee to the ankle.
<u>outfit</u>	Provide with equipment. <i>Warders outfitted in special suits.</i>
<u>pants</u>	Underpants worn by women. <i>He thought we were going to be absolute pants.</i>
<u>robe</u>	Clothe in a robe or long loose outer garment. <i>The Chamberlain robed the king on coronation day.</i>
sandal	A shoe consisting of a sole fastened by straps to the foot. <i>They were dressed in open toed sandals.</i>
<u>shoes</u>	A particular situation.
skimpy	Providing or consisting of less than is needed; meagre. <i>A skimpy dress.</i>

swimsuit	A woman's one-piece swimming costume.
undergarment	A garment worn under other garments.
underwear	Clothing worn under other clothes, typically next to the skin.
uniformed	Dressed in a uniform. <i>Uniformed policemen lined the President's route.</i>
vestment	Gown (especially ceremonial garments) worn by the clergy. <i>A priest in green vestments came and preached a long sermon.</i>
wear	The wearing of something or the state of being worn as clothing. <i>She was wearing yellow that day.</i>
