<b><u>accord</u></b>	Agreement or harmony. <i>The government and the rebels are in <b>accord</b> on one point.</i>
<b>agreement</b>	The condition of having the same number, gender, case, and/or person as another word. <i><b>Agreement</b> between experimental observations and theory.</i>
<b>alike</b>	Similarity in appearance or character or nature between persons or things.
<b>colourlessness</b>	The visual property of being without chromatic color.
<b>comparability</b>	The fact or quality of being similar and able to be compared. <i>There are differences in hospital recording practices that will affect the <b>comparability</b> of results.</i>
<b>compatibility</b>	A feeling of sympathetic understanding. <i>They felt the bond of true <b>compatibility</b>.</i>

<u>concord</u>	The determination of grammatical inflection on the basis of word relations. <i>A pact of peace and <b>concord</b>.</i>
<u>conformity</u>	Acting according to certain accepted standards. <i>The goods were in <b>conformity</b> with the contract.</i>
<u>consistency</u>	The property of holding together and retaining its shape. <i>The sauce has the <b>consistency</b> of creamed butter.</i>
constancy	The quality of being faithful and dependable. <i>She did not think much of married bliss yet she approved of <b>constancy</b>.</i>
<u>correspondence</u>	Communication by the exchange of letters. <i>The results of two tests were in <b>correspondence</b>.</i>
drabness	Having a drab or dowdy quality; lacking stylishness or elegance.
dreariness	Extreme dullness; lacking spirit or interest.
dullness	The quality of being slow to understand. <i><b>Dullness</b> of comprehension.</i>
equality	The state of being equal, especially in status, rights, or opportunities. <i>An organization aiming to promote racial <b>equality</b>.</i>
equivalence	The condition of being equal or equivalent in value, worth, function, etc. <i>Precise <b>equivalences</b> between qualifications across Europe.</i>
evenness	The parity of even numbers (divisible by two).
flatness	Lack of activity of trade, prices, etc.; sluggishness. <i>There s no escaping the <b>flatness</b> of the characters.</i>
homogeneity	The quality of being of uniform throughout in composition or structure. <i>The cultural <b>homogeneity</b> of our society.</i>
homogeneousness	The quality of being similar or comparable in kind or nature.
humdrumness	The quality of wearisome constancy, routine, and lack of variety.
identicalness	Exact sameness.
interchangeability	The quality of being capable of exchange or interchange.
invariability	The quality of being resistant to variation.
invariableness	A quantity that does not vary.
lack of change	The state of needing something that is absent or unavailable.
lack of variation	The state of needing something that is absent or unavailable.
lack of variety	The state of needing something that is absent or unavailable.

<b>likeness</b>	The fact or quality of being alike; resemblance. <i>The only known <b>likeness</b> of Dorothy as a young woman.</i>
<b><u>monotony</u></b>	Sameness of pitch or tone in a sound or utterance. <i>You can become resigned to the <b>monotony</b> of captivity.</i>
<b>parallelism</b>	The use of successive verbal constructions in poetry or prose which correspond in grammatical structure, sound, metre, meaning, etc. <i>The <b>parallelisms</b> are reinforced by frequent alliteration.</i>
<b>regularity</b>	The quality of being characterized by a fixed principle or rate. <i>He came to see her with increasing <b>regularity</b>.</i>
<b><u>resemblance</u></b>	The state of resembling or being alike. <i>The physical <b>resemblances</b> between humans and apes.</i>
<b><u>sameness</u></b>	The quality of being alike. <i><b>Sameness</b> of purpose kept them together.</i>
<b>similarity</b>	A similar feature or aspect. <i>The <b>similarity</b> of symptoms makes them hard to diagnose.</i>
<b><u>stability</u></b>	The quality or attribute of being firm and steadfast. <i>There are fears for the political <b>stability</b> of the area.</i>
<b>steadiness</b>	The quality of being controlled, and not faltering or wavering. <i>We got a glimpse of the <b>steadiness</b> and maturity we need to steer through this crisis.</i>
<b><u>symmetry</u></b>	(mathematics) an attribute of a shape or relation; exact reflection of form on opposite sides of a dividing line or plane. <i>A crystal structure with hexagonal <b>symmetry</b>.</i>
<b>tediousness</b>	Dullness owing to length or slowness.
<b>tedium</b>	The feeling of being bored by something tedious. <i>The <b>tedium</b> of car journeys.</i>
<b>uniformness</b>	The quality of lacking diversity or variation (even to the point of boredom).

## Associations of "Uniformity" (30 Words)

### accordance

Conformity or agreement.

*The **accordance** to Canada of rights of access.*

### akin

Similar in quality or character.

*My parents were **akin** probably half cousins.*

### **alike**

In a like manner.

*The houses all looked **alike**.*

### **apposition**

A relationship between two or more words or phrases in which the two units are grammatically parallel and have the same referent (e.g. my friend Sue; the first US president, George Washington).

*Rudolph the red nosed reindeer is an example of **apposition**.*

### bore

A person who evokes boredom.

*An 1100 cc road bike **bored** out to 1168 cc.*

<b>cognate</b>	A word is cognate with another if both derive from the same word in an ancestral language. <i><b>Cognate</b> subjects such as physics and chemistry.</i>
<u><b>coherence</b></u>	The quality of forming a unified whole. <i>This raises further questions on the <b>coherence</b> of state policy.</i>
<u><b>comparable</b></u>	Of equivalent quality; worthy of comparison. <i>The situation in Holland is <b>comparable</b> to that in England.</i>
<b>congruence</b>	The quality of agreeing; being suitable and appropriate. <i>The results show quite good <b>congruence</b> with recent studies.</i>
<b>connate</b>	(of parts) united so as to form a single part. <i>A <b>connate</b> tomato flower.</i>
<u><b>consistent</b></u>	Sometimes followed by with in agreement or consistent or reliable. <i>I have decided that the course of conduct which I am following is <b>consistent</b> with my sense of responsibility as president in time of war.</i>
<b>corresponding</b>	Conforming in every respect. <i>Boxes with <b>corresponding</b> dimensions.</i>
<u><b>equity</b></u>	Conformity with rules or standards. <i><b>Equity</b> of treatment.</i>
<b>equivalent</b>	The atomic weight of an element that has the same combining capacity as a given weight of another element; the standard is 8 for oxygen. <i>Send two dollars or the <b>equivalent</b> in stamps.</i>
<b>ethnic</b>	A person who is a member of an ethnic group. <i><b>Ethnic</b> and cultural rights and traditions.</i>
<u><b>familial</b></u>	Occurring among members of a family usually by heredity. <i><b>Familial</b> relationships.</i>
<b>genetic</b>	Of or relating to the science of genetics. <i><b>Genetic</b> abnormalities.</i>
<b>homogeneity</b>	The quality or state of being all the same or all of the same kind. <i>There is a remarkable <b>homogeneity</b> between the two companies.</i>
<b>homophonic</b>	Having a single melodic line with accompaniment.
<u><b>identical</b></u>	Similar in every detail; exactly alike. <i>An <b>identical</b> proposition.</i>
<b>inborn</b>	Existing from birth. <i>People think doctors have <b>inborn</b> compassion.</i>
<b>indistinguishable</b>	Not able to be identified as different or distinct. <i>A colorless person quite <b>indistinguishable</b> from the colorless mass of humanity.</i>

<b>inherence</b>	The state of inhering; the state of being a fixed characteristic. <i>The <b>inherence</b> of polysemy in human language.</i>
<b>inherited</b>	(of a quality, characteristic, or predisposition) derived genetically from one's parents or ancestors. <i><b>Inherited</b> diseases.</i>
<b>one</b>	Being a single entity made by combining separate components. <i>She s <b>one</b> girl in a million.</i>
<u><b>predisposition</b></u>	A liability or tendency to suffer from a particular condition, hold a particular attitude, or act in a particular way. <i>Factors including genetic <b>predisposition</b>.</i>
<b>related</b>	Belonging to the same family, group, or type; connected. <i><b>Related</b> to micelle formation is the ability of detergent actives to congregate at oil water interfaces.</i>
<b>relation</b>	The principle that an act done at a later time is deemed by law to have occurred at an earlier time. <i>The improvement in <b>relations</b> between the two countries.</i>
<b>same</b>	Same in identity. <i>The <b>same</b> day next year.</i>
<u><b>twin</b></u>	A twin engined aircraft. <i>Her <b>twin</b> sister.</i>
