Definitions of "Unify" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “unify” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Bring together for a common purpose or action or ideology or in a shared situation.*
- *Act in concert or unite in a common purpose or belief.*
- *Become one.*
- *To bring or combine together or with something else.*
- *Make or become united, uniform, or whole.*
- *Join or combine.*



Synonyms of "Unify" as a verb (21 Words)

amalgamate	Alloy (a metal) with mercury. <i>He amalgamated his company with another.</i>
<u>bind</u>	Of a quantifier be applied to a given variable so that the variable falls within its scope For example in an expression of the form For every x if x is a dog x is an animal the universal quantifier is binding the variable x. <i>We have many ties that bind us historical cultural and economical.</i>
blend	Blend or harmonize. <i>Costumes music and lighting all blend together beautifully.</i>
bring together	Be sold for a certain price.
<u>coalesce</u>	Mix together different elements. <i>His idea served to coalesce all that happened into one connected whole.</i>
combine	Combine so as to form a whole mix. <i>High tides and winds combined to bring chaos to the east coast.</i>
commix	Mix; mingle. <i>Beat them till they be thoroughly commixed.</i>
<u>consolidate</u>	Form into a solid mass or whole. <i>The town and county schools are being consolidated.</i>

federate	Unite on a federal basis or band together as a league. <i>In 1901 the six colonies federated to form the Commonwealth of Australia.</i>
<u>fuse</u>	Cause an electrical appliance to stop working when a fuse melts. <i>Powdered glass was fused to a metal base.</i>
integrate	Become one become integrated. <i>A fully equipped laboratory is being integrated into the development.</i>
join	Be or become joined or united or linked. <i>After the show we were joined by Jessica s sister.</i>
join together	Make contact or come together.
link up	Connect, fasten, or put together two or more pieces.
marry	Perform a marriage ceremony. <i>They had no plans to marry.</i>
<u>merge</u>	Absorb (a title or estate) in another. <i>The merchant bank merged with another broker.</i>
<u>mingle</u>	Be all mixed up or jumbled together. <i>A smell which mingled disinfectant and soap.</i>
mix	Mix together different elements. <i>Mixing concrete is hard physical work.</i>
synthesize	Make (something) by synthesis, especially chemically. <i>Pupils should synthesize the data they have gathered.</i>
unite	Act in concert or unite in a common purpose or belief. <i>The two Germanys officially united.</i>
weld together	Unite closely or intimately.

Usage Examples of "Unify" as a verb

- *The government hoped to centralize and unify the nation.*
- *Opposition groups struggling to unify around the goal of replacing the regime.*

<u>ally</u>	A state formally cooperating with another for a military or other purpose. <i>He s a good ally in fight.</i>
amalgamate	Joined together into a whole. <i>He amalgamated his company with another.</i>

<u>annex</u>	Add or attach as a condition or consequence. <i>Extreme anointing hath neither ordinance of God to be grounded on nor promise of grace annexed.</i>
blend	The act of blending components together thoroughly. <i>She would have to employ a permanent bodyguard in the house someone who would blend in.</i>
<u>coalesce</u>	Mix together different elements. <i>The puddles had coalesced into shallow streams.</i>
coalesced	Joined together into a whole.
coalescing	Growing together, fusing.
coeducation	Education of men and women in the same institutions.
combine	Combine so as to form a whole mix. <i>A new product which combines the benefits of a hairspray and a gel.</i>
combined	Made or joined or united into one.
commingle	Mix; blend. <i>The part of the brain where the senses commingle.</i>
confederacy	A union of people or groups formed for an illicit purpose. <i>The Yakuza is a secret confederacy of criminal fraternities.</i>
conjugate	A mixture of two partially miscible liquids A and B produces two conjugate solutions one of A in B and another of B in A. <i>Conjugate the verb.</i>
<u>consolidate</u>	Make firm or secure; strengthen. <i>The town and county schools are being consolidated.</i>
consolidation	The act of combining into an integral whole. <i>A consolidation of data within an enterprise.</i>
converge	Approach a limit as the number of terms increases without limit. <i>The crowd converged on the movie star.</i>
federate	Relating to a federated state or organization. <i>The country was federated after the civil war.</i>
<u>flux</u>	Treat a metal object with a flux to promote melting. <i>The whole political system is in a state of flux.</i>
incorporation	Learning (of values or attitudes etc.) that is incorporated within yourself. <i>The City Council opposed all new incorporations.</i>
integrate	Become one become integrated. <i>A fully equipped laboratory is being integrated into the development.</i>
integration	The intermixing of people who were previously segregated. <i>Mathematical integrations.</i>

<u>meld</u>	A thing formed by melding a combination. <i>A meld of many contributions.</i>
<u>merge</u>	Mix together different elements. <i>We merged our resources.</i>
reunify	Unify again, as of a country. <i>Will Korea reunify.</i>
<u>solidify</u>	Make solid or more solid cause to solidify. <i>Social and political pressures helped to solidify national identities.</i>
synthesis	(in Hegelian philosophy) the final stage in the process of dialectical reasoning, in which a new idea resolves the conflict between thesis and antithesis. <i>The synthesis of methanol from carbon monoxide and hydrogen.</i>
<u>union</u>	The operation of forming a union. <i>He was opposed to closer political or economic union with Europe.</i>
unite	Act in concert or unite in a common purpose or belief. <i>He called on the party to unite.</i>
<u>united</u>	Used in names of soccer and other sports teams formed by amalgamation. <i>Presented a united front.</i>
weld	Forge an article by welding. <i>Her gratitude welded her to him.</i>
