- *Involving only one part or side.*
- *(of an action or decision) performed by or affecting only one person, group, or country involved in a situation, without the agreement of another or the others.*

<b>decision</b>	The ability or tendency to make decisions quickly decisiveness. <i>Had little trouble in taking a unanimous <b>decision</b> over his opponent.</i>
<b>decisive</b>	Settling an issue; producing a definite result. <i>Two factors had a <b>decisive</b> influence.</i>
<b>definitive</b>	A definitive postage stamp. <i>The <b>definitive</b> work on Greece.</i>
<b>determination</b>	The act of making up your mind about something. <i>His <b>determination</b> showed in his every movement.</i>
<b>determine</b>	Find out learn or determine with certainty usually by making an inquiry or other effort. <i>She <b>determined</b> to tackle Stephen the next day.</i>
<b>deterministic</b>	Relating to the philosophical doctrine that all events, including human action, are ultimately determined by causes regarded as external to the will. <i>A <b>deterministic</b> theory.</i>
<b>direct</b>	Direct the course determine the direction of travelling. <i>A <b>direct</b> route.</i>
<b>exclusive</b>	Catering for or available to only a few, select customers; high class and expensive. <i>One of Britain s most <b>exclusive</b> clubs.</i>
<b>firmness</b>	Resolute determination and strength of character. <i>I felt the <b>firmness</b> of his upper arm.</i>

<b>individually</b>	In a distinctive manner. <i>Taken <b>individually</b> the rooms were in fact square.</i>
<b>irrevocable</b>	Incapable of being retracted or revoked- Shakespeare. <i>Firm and <b>irrevocable</b> is my doom.</i>
<b>lineal</b>	In a straight unbroken line of descent from parent to child. <i><b>Lineal</b> ancestors.</i>
<b>one</b>	Being a single entity made by combining separate components. <i><b>One</b> place or another.</i>
<b>only</b>	Being the only one single and isolated from others. <i>A final report reached him <b>only</b> on January 15.</i>
<b>optional</b>	Possible but not necessary; left to personal choice. <i>A wide range of <b>optional</b> excursions is offered.</i>
<b>predetermine</b>	Determine beforehand. <i>Closed questions almost <b>predetermine</b> the response given.</i>
<b>resolve</b>	(of something seen at a distance) turn into a different form when seen more clearly. <i>He <b>resolved</b> never to drink again.</i>
<b>resolved</b>	Firmly determined to do something. <i>Mysteries solved and unsolved problems <b>resolved</b> and <b>unresolved</b>.</i>
<b>select</b>	Pick out select or choose from a number of alternatives. <i>He has been <b>selected</b> to take part.</i>
<b>selected</b>	Chosen in preference to another.
<b>selection</b>	A plot of land acquired by selection. <i>I make Dayflower the <b>selection</b> for the Irish 1000 Guineas.</i>
<b>selective</b>	Tending to select; characterized by careful choice- John Mason Brown. <i>A new marine VHF radio with digital <b>selective</b> calling.</i>
<b>selectively</b>	By selection; in a selective manner. <i>He accused state officials of <b>selectively</b> enforcing the law.</i>
<b>side</b>	Spin given to the cue ball in snooker and billiards by hitting it on one side. <i>A <b>side</b> entrance.</i>
