Synonyms of "Unimpeded" as an adjective (11 Words)

<u>clear</u>	Clear and distinct to the senses easily perceptible. A clear case of poisoning.
free	(of power or energy) disengaged or available. <i>He pulled his arm free and ran.</i>
open	Of textures full of small openings or gaps. Both sides played fast open rugby to produce a high scoring game.
unchecked	(especially of something undesirable) not controlled or restrained. Prices rose unchecked hitting the poor worst of all.
unconstrained	Not restricted or limited. The dog was unconstrained .
unhampered	Not slowed or blocked or interfered with. Unhampered dissemination of news.



unhindered	Not hindered or obstructed. An exhilarating walk unhindered by walls and fences.
<u>uninhibited</u>	Expressing one's feelings or thoughts unselfconsciously and without restraint. <i>Fits of uninhibited laughter.</i>
unlimited	Without reservation or exception. Offshore reserves of gas and oil are not unlimited .
unrestricted	Free of restrictions on conduct. Unrestricted verbs are usually stronger than those qualified by adverbs.
untrammelled	Not confined or limited. A mind untrammelled by convention.

Usage Examples of "Unimpeded" as an adjective

- An unimpeded view across the headland.
- An unimpeded sweep of meadows and hills afforded a peaceful setting.
- A time of unimpeded growth.
