### Definitions of "Unimportance" as a noun

- *The state of being humble and unimportant.*
- *The state or fact of lacking in importance or significance.*
- *The quality of not being important or worthy of note.*

### Synonyms of "Unimportance" as a noun (9 Words)

<b>frivolousness</b>	The trait of being frivolous; not serious or sensible.
<b>humbleness</b>	A humble feeling.
<b>inconsequence</b>	Invalid or incorrect reasoning.
<b>insignificance</b>	The quality of being too small or unimportant to be worth consideration. <i>He is aware of his own <b>insignificance</b> within the bigger picture.</i>
<b>lowliness</b>	A position of inferior status; low in station or rank or fortune or estimation.
<b>obscureness</b>	The state of being humble and unimportant.
<b>paltriness</b>	Worthlessness due to insignificance.

<b>pettiness</b>	Lack of generosity in trifling matters. <i>The sheer <b>pettiness</b> of the officials was quite startling.</i>
<b>slightness</b>	The property of an attractively thin person.

## Associations of "Unimportance" (30 Words)

<b>bauble</b>	A mock scepter carried by a court jester. <i>Once stripped of their tinsel and <b>baubles</b> most Christmas trees end up in landfill.</i>
<a href="#"><u>ethereal</u></a>	Characterized by lightness and insubstantiality; as impalpable or intangible as air- Thomas Carlyle. <i><b>Ethereal</b> otherworldly visions.</i>
<b>flimsy</b>	Insubstantial and easily damaged. <i>A <b>flimsy</b> table.</i>
<b>frivolous</b>	Not having any serious purpose or value. <i>The <b>frivolous</b> fun loving flappers of the twenties.</i>
<a href="#"><u>immaterial</u></a>	(often followed by `to') lacking importance; not mattering one way or the other. <i>We have <b>immaterial</b> souls.</i>
<a href="#"><u>inconsequential</u></a>	Not important or significant. <i>They talked about <b>inconsequential</b> things.</i>
<b>inconsiderable</b>	Unimportant or insignificant. <i>A not <b>inconsiderable</b> amount of money.</i>
<b>indifferent</b>	Neither too great nor too little. <i>A gifted painter but an <b>indifferent</b> actor.</i>
<a href="#"><u>insignificant</u></a>	Meaningless. <i><b>Insignificant</b> yet enchanting phrases.</i>
<b>insubstantial</b>	Lacking in nutritive value. <i>Vinyl siding has become the standard bearer for cheap <b>insubstantial</b> construction.</i>
<b>lightweight</b>	A lightweight boxer or other competitor. <i>The film was entertaining if rather <b>lightweight</b>.</i>
<b>meanness</b>	Lack of quality or attractiveness; shabbiness. <i>He is also callous with a streak of <b>meanness</b>.</i>

<b>miniature</b>	Being on a very small scale. <i>Children dressed as <b>miniature</b> adults.</i>
<b>minor</b>	A minor term or premise. <i>She requested a number of <b>minor</b> alterations.</i>
<b>negligible</b>	Not worth considering. <i>The effect was <b>negligible</b>.</i>
<b>nominal</b>	Existing in name only. <i>The <b>nominal</b> GDP.</i>
<b>paltry</b>	Petty; trivial. <i>A <b>paltry</b> wage.</i>
<b>peccadillo</b>	A relatively minor fault or sin. <i>The sexual <b>peccadilloes</b> of celebrities aren't necessarily news.</i>
<b>pettiness</b>	The quality of being unimportant and petty or frivolous. <i>Try to overlook insults and <b>pettinesses</b>.</i>
<b>petty</b>	Of secondary or lesser importance, rank, or scale; minor. <i><b>Petty</b> little comments.</i>
<b>picayune</b>	Small and of little importance. <i>The <b>picayune</b> squabbling of party politicians.</i>
<b>piddling</b>	Pathetically trivial; trifling. <i><b>Piddling</b> little questions.</i>
<b>secondary</b>	A secondary feather. <i>The lead acid accumulator used in cars consists of <b>secondary</b> cells.</i>
<b>slight</b>	Being of delicate or slender build- Frank Norris. <i>He was seething at the <b>slight</b> to his authority.</i>
<b>tenuous</b>	Lacking substance or significance. <i>A <b>tenuous</b> thread.</i>
<b>trifling</b>	The deliberate act of delaying and playing instead of working. <i>A <b>trifling</b> matter.</i>
<b>trivial</b>	Concerned with trivialities. <i><b>Trivial</b> details.</i>
<b>undersized</b>	Of less than the usual size. <i>The <b>undersized</b> cubs may not survive the winter.</i>
<b>undistinguished</b>	Lacking distinction; unexceptional. <i>An <b>undistinguished</b> career.</i>
<b>unessential</b>	Not basic or fundamental. <i>A train has broken down resulting in a call to postpone all <b>unessential</b> travel.</i>
