- The quality of not being important or worthy of note.

Synonyms of "Unimportance" as a noun (9 Words)

frivolousness	The trait of being frivolous; not serious or sensible.
humbleness	A humble feeling.
inconsequence	Invalid or incorrect reasoning.
insignificance	The quality of being too small or unimportant to be worth consideration. <i>He is aware of his own</i> insignificance within the bigger picture.
lowliness	A position of inferior status; low in station or rank or fortune or estimation.
obscureness	The state of being humble and unimportant.
paltriness	Worthlessness due to insignificance.



pettiness	Lack of generosity in trifling matters. <i>The sheer pettiness of the officials was quite startling.</i>
slightness	The property of an attractively thin person.

Associations of "Unimportance" (30 Words)

bauble	A mock scepter carried by a court jester. Once stripped of their tinsel and bauble s most Christmas trees end up in landfill.
<u>ethereal</u>	Characterized by lightness and insubstantiality; as impalpable or intangible as air- Thomas Carlyle. <i>Ethereal otherworldly visions.</i>
flimsy	Insubstantial and easily damaged. A flimsy table.
frivolous	Not having any serious purpose or value. The frivolous fun loving flappers of the twenties.
<u>immaterial</u>	(often followed by `to') lacking importance; not mattering one way or the other. <i>We have immaterial souls.</i>
<u>inconsequential</u>	Not important or significant. They talked about inconsequential things.
inconsiderable	Unimportant or insignificant. A not inconsiderable amount of money.
indifferent	Neither too great nor too little. A gifted painter but an indifferent actor.
<u>insignificant</u>	Meaningless. Insignificant yet enchanting phrases.
insubstantial	Lacking in nutritive value. <i>Vinyl siding has become the standard bearer for cheap</i> insubstantial <i>construction.</i>
lightweight	A lightweight boxer or other competitor. The film was entertaining if rather lightweight .
meanness	Lack of quality or attractiveness; shabbiness. <i>He is also callous with a streak of meanness.</i>



miniature	Being on a very small scale. Children dressed as miniature adults.
<u>minor</u>	A minor term or premise. She requested a number of minor alterations.
<u>negligible</u>	Not worth considering. <i>The effect was negligible</i> .
nominal	Existing in name only. <i>The nominal GDP.</i>
paltry	Petty; trivial. A paltry wage.
peccadillo	A relatively minor fault or sin. The sexual peccadillo es of celebrities aren t necessarily news.
pettiness	The quality of being unimportant and petty or frivolous. <i>Try to overlook insults and pettinesses.</i>
petty	Of secondary or lesser importance, rank, or scale; minor. Petty little comments.
picayune	Small and of little importance. The picayune squabbling of party politicians.
piddling	Pathetically trivial; trifling. <i>Piddling</i> little questions.
<u>secondary</u>	A secondary feather. The lead acid accumulator used in cars consists of secondary cells.
slight	Being of delicate or slender build- Frank Norris. <i>He was seething at the slight to his authority.</i>
<u>tenuous</u>	Lacking substance or significance. A tenuous thread.
trifling	The deliberate act of delaying and playing instead of working. A trifling matter.
<u>trivial</u>	Concerned with trivialities. <i>Trivial details</i> .
undersized	Of less than the usual size. The undersized cubs may not survive the winter.
undistinguished	Lacking distinction; unexceptional. An undistinguished career.
unessential	Not basic or fundamental. A train has broken down resulting in a call to postpone all unessential travel.
