abandoned	Unrestrained and uninhibited. <i>An abandoned sadness born of grief.</i>
<u>candid</u>	(of a photograph of a person) taken informally, especially without the subject's knowledge. <i>His responses were remarkably candid.</i>
carefree	Free from anxiety or responsibility. <i>Carefree with his money.</i>
extrovert	Relating to denoting or typical of an extrovert. <i>His extrovert personality made him the ideal host.</i>
forthright	Characterized by directness in manner or speech; without subtlety or evasion. <i>His most forthright attack yet on the reforms.</i>

frank	Open, honest, and direct in speech or writing, especially when dealing with unpalatable matters. <i>A long and frank discussion.</i>
free and easy	Completely wanting or lacking.
<u>impetuous</u>	Marked by violent force. <i>An impetuous display of spending and gambling.</i>
informal	Having or fostering a warm or friendly and informal atmosphere. <i>An informal agreement between the two companies.</i>
instinctive	(of a person) doing or being a specified thing apparently naturally or automatically. <i>He was an instinctive cook.</i>
liberated	(of a person) free from social conventions or traditional ideas, especially with regard to sexual roles. <i>The modern image of the independent liberated woman.</i>
open	Full of small openings or gaps. <i>Open ballots.</i>
<u>outgoing</u>	Going out or away from a particular place. <i>An outgoing steamship.</i>
<u>outspoken</u>	Given to expressing yourself freely or insistently. <i>Outspoken in their opposition to segregation.</i>
<u>reckless</u>	Marked by defiant disregard for danger or consequences. <i>You mustn't be so reckless.</i>
relaxed	Without strain or anxiety. <i>A relaxed and informal discussion.</i>
shameless	(of a person or their conduct) characterized by or showing a lack of shame; barefaced or brazen. <i>His shameless hypocrisy.</i>
<u>spontaneous</u>	Performed or occurring as a result of a sudden impulse or inclination and without premeditation or external stimulus. <i>Spontaneous laughter.</i>
unconstrained	Not restricted or limited. <i>The dog was unconstrained.</i>
unrepressed	Not repressed or inhibited. <i>A natural and unrepressed sexuality.</i>
unreserved	Not reserved. <i>He has had their unreserved support.</i>

unrestrained

Marked by uncontrolled excitement or emotion.

Unrestrained laughter.

unselfconscious

Not suffering from or exhibiting self-consciousness; not shy or embarrassed.

She grew up with him in **unselfconscious** friendship.

wild

Produced from wild animals or plants without cultivation.

A **wild** stretch of land.

boundless	Seemingly boundless in amount number degree or especially extent. <i>Children with boundless energy.</i>
<u>ceaseless</u>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The ceaseless thunder of surf.</i>
changeless	Remaining the same for indefinitely long times. <i>Changeless truths.</i>
<u>continually</u>	Without interruption; constantly. <i>I was continually moving around.</i>
continue	Continue a certain state condition or activity. <i>I know it s hard he continued but there is no choice.</i>

continuously	At every point. <i>These images loop continuously.</i>
endless	Having no known beginning and presumably no end. <i>We smoked endless cigarettes.</i>
<u>eternal</u>	Used to refer to an everlasting or universal spirit, as represented by God. <i>Eternal truths.</i>
<u>forever</u>	For a limitless time. <i>She would love him forever.</i>
<u>grinding</u>	A harsh and strident sound as of the grinding of gears. <i>The grinding roar of the lorries.</i>
illimitable	Without limits or an end. <i>The illimitable human capacity for evil.</i>
<u>immortal</u>	An immortal being especially a god of ancient Greece or Rome. <i>He will always be one of the immortals of soccer.</i>
incessant	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>Night and day we live with the incessant noise of the city.</i>
inexhaustible	Incapable of being entirely consumed or used up. <i>His inexhaustible energy.</i>
<u>infinite</u>	A space or quantity that is infinite. <i>The boundless regions of the infinite.</i>
interminable	Endless or apparently endless (often used hyperbolically). <i>An interminable sermon.</i>
<u>limitless</u>	Without limits in extent or size or quantity. <i>Limitless vastness of our solar system.</i>
measureless	Having no bounds or limits; unlimited. <i>Otto had measureless charm.</i>
perpetual	Occurring repeatedly; so frequent as to seem endless and uninterrupted. <i>A perpetual secretary of the society.</i>
renewable	A natural resource or source of energy that is not depleted by use, such as water, wind, or solar power. <i>Renewable energy such as solar energy is theoretically inexhaustible.</i>
<u>spontaneous</u>	(of a process or event) occurring without apparent external cause. <i>Spontaneous miscarriages.</i>
<u>unbounded</u>	Having or appearing to have no limits. <i>Unbounded enthusiasm.</i>
<u>unbridled</u>	Not restrained or controlled. <i>Unbridled lust.</i>

<u>unchecked</u>	(especially of something undesirable) not controlled or restrained. <i>An unchecked temper.</i>
<u>undying</u>	(especially of an emotion) lasting forever. <i>His undying fame.</i>
unfettered	Not bound by shackles and chains. <i>Unfettered artistic genius.</i>
unlimited	Having no limits in range or scope- Philip Rahv. <i>Offshore reserves of gas and oil are not unlimited.</i>
unreserved	Not cautious or reticent. <i>Unreserved grandstand seats.</i>
<u>unrestrained</u>	Not subject to restraint. <i>Unrestrained laughter.</i>
unrestricted	Not subject to or subjected to restriction. <i>Unrestricted access to both military bases.</i>
