- *Not done with purpose or intent.*
- Without deliberate intent- George Macdonald.
- Not done on purpose.

Synonyms of "Unintentional" as an adjective (19 Words)

accidental Happening by chance or unexpectedly or unintentionally.

The location is **accidental** and contributes nothing to the poem.

chance Occurring or appearing or singled out by chance.

A chance occurrence.

coincidental Happening or existing at the same time.

Any resemblance between their reports is purely **coincidental**.



Planned or conceived in detail or for a specific purpose. designed

Style is more than the deliberate and **designed** creation.

Having no cause or apparent cause. **fortuitous**

The similarity between the paintings may not be simply **fortuitous**.

Not resulting from or achieved through deliberate planning. inadvertent

With an **inadvertent** gesture she swept the vase off the table.

Done or made or performed with purpose and intent- Havelock Ellis. intentional

Intentional damage.

Done without will or conscious control. <u>involuntary</u>

She gave an **involuntary** shudder.

Lucky in making unexpected and fortunate discoveries. serendipitous

A **serendipitous** encounter.

Of or concerning the part of the mind of which one is not fully aware but

which influences one's actions and feelings. subconscious

My **subconscious** fear.

Not knowing or perceiving- Charles Dickens. unconscious

Happily **unconscious** of the new calamity at home.

Not expected or regarded as likely to happen. unexpected

His death was totally **unexpected**.

Not anticipated- H.W.Glidden. unforeseen

Unforeseen circumstances.

Not planned or meant. unintended

The **unintended** consequences of people s actions.

Not meant or intended. unmeant

An **unmeant** threat.

Without apparent forethought or prompting or planning. unplanned

Accepts an **unplanned** order.

unpremeditated (of an act, remark, or state) not thought out or planned beforehand.

It was a totally **unpremeditated** attack.

Not exhibiting or characterized by careful thought. unthinking

She was at pains to correct **unthinking** prejudices.

Not aware or knowing. unwitting

An **unwitting** accomplice.

insure Protect by insurance.

The table should be **insure**d for 2 500.

Done against someone's will; compulsory.

involuntary Involuntary muscles.

loath (usually followed by `to') strongly opposed.

I was **loath** to leave.

loathe Find repugnant.

I **loathe** that man.

In a negative way, especially by expressing denial, disagreement, or

negatively refusal

Traffic congestion had impacted negatively on their business.

Opportunistic.

opportunist

The calculating and opportunist politician.
