accidentally Without advance planning. *They met* **accidentally**.

<u>coincidence</u> The **coincidence** of interest between the mining companies and certain

politicians.

happenHappen occur or be the case in the course of events or by chance.

It **happen**s that today is my birthday.

happenstance An event that might have been arranged although it was really accidental.

An untoward **happenstance** for Trudy.

inadvertently Without knowledge or intention.

His name had been **inadvertently** omitted from the list.

(sometimes followed by `to') minor or casual or subordinate in significance

incident or nature or occurring as a chance concomitant or consequence.

The **incident** angle.

incidentally Introducing a different topic.

Incidentally it was many months before the whole truth was discovered.

Deliberately; on purpose.

intentionally He used that word intentionally.

involuntary

Done against someone's will; compulsory.

It becoming a hero was **involuntary** They sank my boat.

occur Happen; take place.

Sexism **occur**s in many workplaces.

overhear Hear, usually without the knowledge of the speakers.

We **overhear**d the conversation at the next table.



unaware (often followed by `of') not aware.

Unaware of the newborn hope.

unconsciously Without awareness.

Ben smiled **unconsciously** when he heard her voice.

undiscovered Not discovered.

The novel had lain **undiscovered** for years among his papers.

unexpectedNot expected or regarded as likely to happen.

He seemed to have a knack for saying the **unexpected**.

unexpectedly In a way that was not expected.

Tourist chiefs reported **unexpectedly** high visitor numbers.

unidentified Not recognized or identified.

An **unidentified** witness.

unintended Not deliberate.

The **unintended** consequences of people s actions.

unintentional The translation added a lease of

unknowingly Without knowledge or intention.

Every day we are **unknowingly** exposed to a variety of pesticides.

unknown An unknown and unexplored region.

An **unknown** island.

Being or having an unknown or unnamed source.

unwitting Not done on purpose; unintentional.

His rudeness was **unwitting**.

unwittingly Without being aware; unintentionally.
