Associations of “Unintentionally” (30 Words)

accident	The working of fortune; chance. <i>Four people were killed in a road accident.</i>
accidental	(in Aristotelian thought) relating to or denoting properties which are not essential to a thing's nature. <i>A verdict of accidental death.</i>
accidentally	By chance; inadvertently. <i>Accidentally knocked the vase over.</i>
blurt	Utter impulsively. <i>She blurted out the truth.</i>
carelessly	In a casual or reckless way; inattentively. <i>Roadsides are full of litter thrown carelessly by passers by.</i>
casually	Not methodically or according to plan. <i>I wouldn't introduce my family to people I was casually dating.</i>
coincidence	The temporal property of two things happening at the same time. <i>The coincidence of interest between the mining companies and certain politicians.</i>
happen	Happen occur or be the case in the course of events or by chance. <i>It happens that today is my birthday.</i>
happenstance	An event that might have been arranged although it was really accidental. <i>An untoward happenstance for Trudy.</i>
inadvertently	Without knowledge or intention. <i>His name had been inadvertently omitted from the list.</i>

incident	(sometimes followed by `to') minor or casual or subordinate in significance or nature or occurring as a chance concomitant or consequence. <i>The incident angle.</i>
incidentally	Introducing a different topic. <i>Incidentally it was many months before the whole truth was discovered.</i>
intentionally	Deliberately; on purpose. <i>He used that word intentionally.</i>
involuntary	Done against someone's will; compulsory. <i>It becoming a hero was involuntary They sank my boat.</i>
occur	Happen; take place. <i>Sexism occurs in many workplaces.</i>
overhear	Hear, usually without the knowledge of the speakers. <i>We overheard the conversation at the next table.</i>
unaware	(often followed by `of') not aware. <i>Unaware of the newborn hope.</i>
unconsciously	Without awareness. <i>Ben smiled unconsciously when he heard her voice.</i>
undiscovered	Not discovered. <i>The novel had lain undiscovered for years among his papers.</i>
unexpected	Not expected or regarded as likely to happen. <i>He seemed to have a knack for saying the unexpected.</i>
unexpectedly	In a way that was not expected. <i>Tourist chiefs reported unexpectedly high visitor numbers.</i>
unidentified	Not recognized or identified. <i>An unidentified witness.</i>
unintended	Not deliberate. <i>The unintended consequences of people s actions.</i>

unintentional	Not done with purpose or intent. <i>The translation added a layer of unintentional comedy.</i>
unknowingly	Without knowledge or intention. <i>Every day we are unknowingly exposed to a variety of pesticides.</i>
unknown	An unknown and unexplored region. <i>An unknown island.</i>
unnamed	Being or having an unknown or unnamed source. <i>An unnamed donor.</i>
unwitting	Not done on purpose; unintentional. <i>His rudeness was unwitting.</i>
unwittingly	Without being aware; unintentionally. <i>Many users unwittingly expose their personal details to strangers online.</i>
