cool	Psychologically cool and unenthusiastic unfriendly or unresponsive or showing dislike. It ll be a cool afternoon.
degage	Showing lack of emotional involvement. Adopted a degage pose on the arm of the easy chair.
detached	Not fixed in position. A four bedroomed detached house.



disinterested	Having or feeling no interest in something; uninterested. A banker is under an obligation to give disinterested advice.
dispassionate	Not influenced by strong emotion, and so able to be rational and impartial. <i>She dealt with life s disasters in a calm dispassionate way.</i>
emotionless	Not showing any emotion; unemotional. <i>He kept his emotionless objectivity and faith in the cause he served.</i>
half-hearted	Feeling or showing little interest or enthusiasm.
impassive	Deliberately impassive in manner. <i>Her impassive remoteness.</i>
indifferent	Having no particular interest or sympathy; unconcerned. Has an indifferent singing voice.
<u>lackadaisical</u>	Lacking enthusiasm and determination; carelessly lazy. A lackadaisical defence left Spurs adrift in the second half.
lukewarm	Showing little enthusiasm. The film received a lukewarm reception from critics.
non-committal	Refusing to bind oneself to a particular course of action or view or the like.
<u>passive</u>	Accepting or allowing what happens or what others do, without active response or resistance. <i>Passive</i> resistance.
<u>uncaring</u>	Lacking affection or warm feeling. An uncaring person.
<u>unconcerned</u>	Lacking in interest or care or feeling. The prisoner seems entirely unconcerned as to the outcome of the examination.
<u>unemotional</u>	Unsusceptible to or destitute of or showing no emotion. A flat unemotional voice.
unfeeling	Lacking physical sensation or sensitivity. My mother is a cold unfeeling woman.
uninterested	Having no care or interest in knowing. She appeared totally uninterested .
unmoved	Emotionally unmoved. <i>Her opponents were unmoved and plan to return to court.</i>
<u>unresponsive</u>	Aloof or indifferent. Was unresponsive to her passionate advances.
