<b>cool</b>	Psychologically cool and unenthusiastic unfriendly or unresponsive or showing dislike. <i>It ll be a <b>cool</b> afternoon.</i>
<b>degage</b>	Showing lack of emotional involvement. <i>Adopted a <b>degage</b> pose on the arm of the easy chair.</i>
<b>detached</b>	Not fixed in position. <i>A four bedroomed <b>detached</b> house.</i>

<b>disinterested</b>	Having or feeling no interest in something; uninterested. <i>A banker is under an obligation to give <b>disinterested</b> advice.</i>
<b>dispassionate</b>	Not influenced by strong emotion, and so able to be rational and impartial. <i>She dealt with life's disasters in a calm <b>dispassionate</b> way.</i>
<b>emotionless</b>	Not showing any emotion; unemotional. <i>He kept his <b>emotionless</b> objectivity and faith in the cause he served.</i>
<b>half-hearted</b>	Feeling or showing little interest or enthusiasm.
<b>impassive</b>	Deliberately impassive in manner. <i>Her <b>impassive</b> remoteness.</i>
<b>indifferent</b>	Having no particular interest or sympathy; unconcerned. <i>Has an <b>indifferent</b> singing voice.</i>
<b>lackadaisical</b>	Lacking enthusiasm and determination; carelessly lazy. <i>A <b>lackadaisical</b> defence left Spurs adrift in the second half.</i>
<b>lukewarm</b>	Showing little enthusiasm. <i>The film received a <b>lukewarm</b> reception from critics.</i>
<b>non-committal</b>	Refusing to bind oneself to a particular course of action or view or the like.
<b>passive</b>	Accepting or allowing what happens or what others do, without active response or resistance. <i><b>Passive</b> resistance.</i>
<b>uncaring</b>	Lacking affection or warm feeling. <i>An <b>uncaring</b> person.</i>
<b>unconcerned</b>	Lacking in interest or care or feeling. <i>The prisoner seems entirely <b>unconcerned</b> as to the outcome of the examination.</i>
<b>unemotional</b>	Unsusceptible to or destitute of or showing no emotion. <i>A flat <b>unemotional</b> voice.</i>
<b>unfeeling</b>	Lacking physical sensation or sensitivity. <i>My mother is a cold <b>unfeeling</b> woman.</i>
<b>uninterested</b>	Having no care or interest in knowing. <i>She appeared totally <b>uninterested</b>.</i>
<b>unmoved</b>	Emotionally unmoved. <i>Her opponents were <b>unmoved</b> and plan to return to court.</i>
<b>unresponsive</b>	Aloof or indifferent. <i>Was <b>unresponsive</b> to her passionate advances.</i>

- *An uninvolved bystander.*
