<b>corps</b>	A body of people associated together. <i>At 9 30 a m the press <b>corps</b> was handed what looked to be a routine list of orders.</i>
<a href="#">crew</a>	A group of people associated in some way. <i>A <b>crew</b> of assorted computer geeks.</i>
<a href="#">denomination</a>	A branch of any religion. <i>The <b>denomination</b> of a consideration as relevant or irrelevant.</i>
<b>detachment</b>	The state of being objective or aloof. <i>A truck containing a <b>detachment</b> of villagers.</i>
<b>detail</b>	Itemized information about someone. <i>The classical French <b>detail</b> of the building s facade.</i>
<b>division</b>	A group of organisms forming a subdivision of a larger category. <i>The <b>division</b> of his estates between the two branches of his family.</i>

<b>element</b>	Each of more than one hundred substances that cannot be chemically interconverted or broken down into simpler substances and are primary constituents of matter Each element is distinguished by its atomic number i e the number of protons in the nuclei of its atoms. <i>In your <b>element</b>.</i>
<b>factor</b>	With numeral a sunscreen of the sun protection factor specified. <i>Genes were formerly called <b>factors</b>.</i>
<b>feature</b>	A prominent attribute or aspect of something. <i>The <b>feature</b> tonight is Casablanca.</i>
<b>force</b>	The army navy and air force of a country. <i>Left wing guerrilla <b>forces</b>.</i>
<b>formation</b>	Creation by mental activity. <i>The <b>formation</b> of the Great Rift Valley.</i>
<b>fragment</b>	A small part broken off or separated from something. <i>Small <b>fragments</b> of pottery.</i>
<b>garrison</b>	The building occupied by a garrison. <i>The entire <b>garrison</b> was mustered on the parade ground.</i>
<b>ingredient</b>	A component part or element of something. <i>The affair contains all the <b>ingredients</b> of an insoluble mystery.</i>
<b>item</b>	An individual instance of a type of symbol. <i>They reduced the price on many <b>items</b>.</i>
<b>legion</b>	Archaic terms for army. <i><b>Legions</b> of photographers and TV cameras.</i>
<b>measure</b>	Measuring instrument having a sequence of marks at regular intervals used as a reference in making measurements. <i>A furlong is an obsolete <b>measure</b> of length.</i>
<b>measurement</b>	The size, length, or amount of something, as established by measuring. <i>Accurate <b>measurement</b> is essential.</i>
<b>member</b>	An organization that is a member of another organization especially a state that belongs to a group of nations. <i>The library was a <b>member</b> of the interlibrary loan association.</i>
<b>module</b>	Any of a number of distinct but interrelated units from which a program may be built up or into which a complex activity may be analysed. <i>A networking <b>module</b>.</i>

<b><u>outfit</u></b>	Any cohesive unit such as a military company. <i>Her wedding <b>outfit</b>.</i>
<b>part</b>	The melody carried by a particular voice or instrument in polyphonic music. <i>They resisted every effort on his <b>part</b>.</i>
<b>piece</b>	A financial share. <i>It is not known who created this <b>piece</b>.</i>
<b>platoon</b>	A team of policemen working under the military platoon system. <i>A <b>platoon</b> player.</i>
<b><u>portion</u></b>	A person's destiny or lot. <i>Burger joints offering huge <b>portions</b>.</i>
<b><u>quantity</u></b>	The figure or symbol representing a quantity. <i>The <b>quantity</b> and quality of the fruit can be controlled.</i>
<b>regiment</b>	Rule or government. <i>The powers of ecclesiastical <b>regiment</b> which none but the Church should wield.</i>
<b><u>section</u></b>	A small class of students who are part of a larger course but are taught separately. <i>He always turns first to the business <b>section</b>.</i>
<b><u>sector</u></b>	The minimum track length that can be assigned to store information unless otherwise specified a sector of data consists of 512 bytes. <i>He was helpless in an important <b>sector</b> of his life.</i>
<b>segment</b>	A part of a figure cut off by a line or plane intersecting it. <i>A <b>segment</b> of an orange.</i>
<b>social unit</b>	A party of people assembled to promote sociability and communal activity.
<b><u>squad</u></b>	A small squad of policemen trained to deal with a particular kind of crime. <i>The vice <b>squad</b>.</i>
<b>squadron</b>	A principal division of an armoured or cavalry regiment, consisting of two or more troops. <i>He immediately commissioned a <b>squadron</b> of architects.</i>

<b>fathomable</b>	Capable of being penetrated or comprehended.
<b>five</b>	A playing card or a domino or a die whose upward face shows five pips.
<b>gram</b>	A metric unit of mass equal to one thousandth of a kilogram.
<b>inch</b>	Advance slowly as if by inches. <i>I had no intention of budging an <b>inch</b>.</i>
<b>measurable</b>	Of distinguished importance. <i><b>Measurable</b> depths.</i>
<b>meter</b>	Stamp with a meter indicating the postage. <i><b>Meter</b> the mail.</i>

<b>metrical</b>	Based on the meter as a standard of measurement. <i><b>Metrical</b> equivalentents.</i>
<b>multiple</b>	(of a disease, injury, etc.) complex in its nature or effects; affecting several parts of the body. <i>Words with <b>multiple</b> meanings.</i>
<b>organizational</b>	Of or relating to an organization. <i><b>Organizational</b> heads.</i>
<b>ounce</b>	A unit of weight equal to one sixteenth of a pound or 16 drams or 28.349 grams. <i>Robyn summoned up every <b>ounce</b> of strength.</i>
<b>packet</b>	The contents of a packet. <i><b>Packeted</b> fruit pies.</i>
<b>penny</b>	A one-cent coin. <i>We didn t get paid a <b>penny</b>.</i>
<b>pentameter</b>	A line of verse consisting of five metrical feet, or (in Greek and Latin verse) of two halves each of two feet and a long syllable.
<b>phonology</b>	The system of contrastive relationships among the speech sounds that constitute the fundamental components of a language.
<b>pound</b>	The act of pounding delivering repeated heavy blows. <i><b>Pound</b> the roots with a heavy flat stone.</i>

<b>ream</b>	Enlarge with a reamer. <i><b>Ream</b> oranges.</i>
<b>syllabic</b>	Having lines based on number of syllables rather than on rhythmical arrangement of stresses or quantities. <i>The recreation of classical <b>syllabic</b> metres.</i>
<b>ton</b>	A unit of weight or volume of sea cargo equal to a metric ton 1 000 kg or 40 cu ft. <i>All of a sudden I had <b>tons</b> of friends.</i>
<b>vowel</b>	A letter of the alphabet standing for a spoken vowel.
<b>wingspan</b>	The maximum extent across the wings of an aircraft or of a bird or other flying animal, measured from tip to tip. <i>An eagle with a <b>wingspan</b> of 7 ft.</i>
