## Unknowingly as an Adverb

### Definitions of "Unknowingly" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “unknowingly” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *Without knowledge or intention.*
- *Without being aware of something; unintentionally.*

### Synonyms of "Unknowingly" as an adverb (2 Words)

**inadvertently** Without knowledge or intention.  
*His name had been **inadvertently** omitted from the list.*

**unwittingly** Without being aware; unintentionally.  
*He **unwittingly** deleted the references.*

### Usage Examples of "Unknowingly" as an adverb

- *Every day, we are unknowingly exposed to a variety of pesticides.*
- *The Minister, perhaps unknowingly, misled Parliament.*

## Associations of "Unknowingly" (30 Words)

<b>accidentally</b>	Without advance planning. <i><b>Accidentally</b> knocked the vase over.</i>
<b><u>allude</u></b>	Make a more or less disguised reference to. <i>We will <b>allude</b> briefly to the main points.</i>
<b>blurt</b>	Utter impulsively. <i>She <b>blurting</b> out the truth.</i>
<b>casually</b>	In a relaxed and informal way. <i>She was just <b>casually</b> strolling through the mall.</i>
<b>connote</b>	Express or state indirectly. <i>The term modern science usually <b>connotes</b> a complete openness to empirical testing.</i>
<b>describe</b>	Give a description of. <i>The man was <b>described</b> as tall clean shaven and with short dark hair.</i>
<b>dupe</b>	A victim of deception. <i>Men who were simply the <b>dupes</b> of their unscrupulous leaders.</i>
<b><u>entail</u></b>	A property bequeathed under an entail. <i>Landed property was governed by primogeniture and <b>entail</b>.</i>
<b>happen</b>	Happen occur or be the case in the course of events or by chance Santayana. <i>Do you <b>happen</b> to know who her doctor is.</i>
<b>hint</b>	Drop a hint intimate by a hint. <i>He <b>hinted</b> that the sale might be delayed.</i>
<b><u>implicit</u></b>	(of a function) not expressed directly in terms of independent variables. <i>Comments seen as <b>implicit</b> criticism of the policies.</i>
<b><u>imply</u></b>	Suggest as a logically necessary consequence; in logic. <i>Salesmen who use jargon to <b>imply</b> superior knowledge.</i>
<b><u>inadvertently</u></b>	Without intention; accidentally. <i>His name had been <b>inadvertently</b> omitted from the list.</i>
<b><u>incident</u></b>	An instance of something happening; an event or occurrence. <i>One person was stabbed in the <b>incident</b>.</i>
<b>incidentally</b>	In an incidental manner; as a chance occurrence. <i><b>Incidentally</b> it was many months before the whole truth was discovered.</i>
<b>indicate</b>	Indicate a place direction person or thing either spatially or figuratively. <i><b>Indicated</b> his wishes in a letter.</i>

<b><u>insinuate</u></b>	Slide (oneself or a thing) slowly and smoothly into a particular place. <i>He <b>insinuated</b> himself into the conversation of the people at the nearby table.</i>
<b>intentionally</b>	With intention; in an intentional manner. <i>He used that word <b>intentionally</b>.</i>
<b>overhear</b>	Hear (someone or something) without meaning to or without the knowledge of the speaker. <i>We <b>overheard</b> the conversation at the next table.</i>
<b>overtone</b>	(usually plural) an ulterior implicit meaning or quality. <i><b>Overtones</b> of despair.</i>
<b>participate</b>	Become a participant; be involved in. <i>Both members <b>participate</b> of harmony.</i>
<b><u>unaware</u></b>	Having no knowledge of a situation or fact. <i>Seemed <b>unaware</b> of the scrutiny.</i>
<b>unconsciously</b>	Without realizing or being aware of one's actions. <i>Ben smiled <b>unconsciously</b> when he heard her voice.</i>
<b><u>unexpected</u></b>	Not expected or anticipated. <i><b>Unexpected</b> guests.</i>
<b>unexpectedly</b>	In a way that was not expected. <i>He died <b>unexpectedly</b> of a heart attack.</i>
<b><u>unintended</u></b>	Not deliberate. <i>The <b>unintended</b> consequences of people's actions.</i>
<b><u>unintentionally</u></b>	Not on purpose. <i><b>Unintentionally</b> rude song lyrics.</i>
<b>unknown</b>	An unknown and unexplored region. <i>She is a relative <b>unknown</b>.</i>
<b>unwittingly</b>	Without knowledge or intention. <i>Youngsters can become <b>unwittingly</b> involved in gangs.</i>
