Definitions of "Unknowingly" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “unknowingly” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *Without knowledge or intention.*
- *Without being aware of something; unintentionally.*

Synonyms of "Unknowingly" as an adverb (2 Words)

[inadvertently](#) Without knowledge or intention.
*His name had been **inadvertently** omitted from the list.*

[unwittingly](#) Without being aware; unintentionally.
*He **unwittingly** deleted the references.*

Usage Examples of "Unknowingly" as an adverb

- *Every day, we are unknowingly exposed to a variety of pesticides.*
- *The Minister, perhaps unknowingly, misled Parliament.*

Associations of "Unknowingly" (30 Words)

accidentally	Without advance planning. <i>Accidentally knocked the vase over.</i>
<u>allude</u>	Make a more or less disguised reference to. <i>We will allude briefly to the main points.</i>
blurt	Utter impulsively. <i>She blurted out the truth.</i>
casually	In a relaxed and informal way. <i>She was just casually strolling through the mall.</i>
connote	Express or state indirectly. <i>The term modern science usually connotes a complete openness to empirical testing.</i>
describe	Give a description of. <i>The man was described as tall clean shaven and with short dark hair.</i>
dupe	A victim of deception. <i>Men who were simply the dupes of their unscrupulous leaders.</i>
<u>entail</u>	A property bequeathed under an entail. <i>Landed property was governed by primogeniture and entail.</i>
happen	Happen occur or be the case in the course of events or by chance Santayana. <i>Do you happen to know who her doctor is.</i>
hint	Drop a hint intimate by a hint. <i>He hinted that the sale might be delayed.</i>
<u>implicit</u>	(of a function) not expressed directly in terms of independent variables. <i>Comments seen as implicit criticism of the policies.</i>
<u>imply</u>	Suggest as a logically necessary consequence; in logic. <i>Salesmen who use jargon to imply superior knowledge.</i>
<u>inadvertently</u>	Without intention; accidentally. <i>His name had been inadvertently omitted from the list.</i>
<u>incident</u>	An instance of something happening; an event or occurrence. <i>One person was stabbed in the incident.</i>
incidentally	In an incidental manner; as a chance occurrence. <i>Incidentally it was many months before the whole truth was discovered.</i>
indicate	Indicate a place direction person or thing either spatially or figuratively. <i>Indicated his wishes in a letter.</i>

<u>insinuate</u>	Slide (oneself or a thing) slowly and smoothly into a particular place. <i>He insinuated himself into the conversation of the people at the nearby table.</i>
intentionally	With intention; in an intentional manner. <i>He used that word intentionally.</i>
overhear	Hear (someone or something) without meaning to or without the knowledge of the speaker. <i>We overheard the conversation at the next table.</i>
overtone	(usually plural) an ulterior implicit meaning or quality. <i>Overtones of despair.</i>
participate	Become a participant; be involved in. <i>Both members participate of harmony.</i>
<u>unaware</u>	Having no knowledge of a situation or fact. <i>Seemed unaware of the scrutiny.</i>
unconsciously	Without realizing or being aware of one's actions. <i>Ben smiled unconsciously when he heard her voice.</i>
<u>unexpected</u>	Not expected or anticipated. <i>Unexpected guests.</i>
unexpectedly	In a way that was not expected. <i>He died unexpectedly of a heart attack.</i>
<u>unintended</u>	Not deliberate. <i>The unintended consequences of people's actions.</i>
<u>unintentionally</u>	Not on purpose. <i>Unintentionally rude song lyrics.</i>
unknown	An unknown and unexplored region. <i>She is a relative unknown.</i>
unwittingly	Without knowledge or intention. <i>Youngsters can become unwittingly involved in gangs.</i>
