inflammatory Inflammatory cells.

infuriate Make (someone) extremely angry and impatient.

I was **infuriate**d by your article.

irate Feeling or characterized by great anger.

Irate protesters.

A strong emotion; a feeling that is oriented toward some real or supposed

ire grievance.

The plans provoked the **ire** of conservationists.

Dark bluish grey in colour.

madden Make mad.
