Definitions of "Unlikely" as an adjective

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "unlikely" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Not likely to be true or to occur or to have occurred.
- Not likely to happen, be done, or be true; improbable.
- Has little chance of being the case or coming about.
- Having a probability too low to inspire belief.





Synonyms of "Unlikely" as an adjective (22 Words)

implausible Highly imaginative but unlikely.

Gave the teacher an **implausible** excuse.

improbable Too improbable to admit of belief.

The characters have **improbable** names.

inconceivable Not capable of being imagined or grasped mentally; unbelievable.

They behaved with **inconceivable** cruelty.

incredible Difficult to believe; extraordinary.

The noise from the crowd was **incredible**.

laboured (especially of humour or a performance) not spontaneous or fluent.

One of Alan s **laboured** jokes.

not likely Expected to become or be; in prospect.

preposterousSo unreasonable as to invite derision.

A **preposterous** suggestion.

questionable Able to be refuted.

Questionable motives.

remote Distant in time.

A remote relative.

So unreasonable as to invite derision.

ridiculous Her conceited assumption of universal interest in her rather dull children

was **ridiculous**.

Of a mainly liquid substance having been strained to separate out any solid

strained matter.

There was a **strained** silence.

unbelievable So great or extreme as to be difficult to believe; extraordinary.

Unbelievable or not it happened.

unconvincing Having a probability too low to inspire belief.

As **unconvincing** as a forced smile.

unexpectedNot expected or regarded as likely to happen.

Unexpected news.

unimaginable Difficult or impossible to imagine or comprehend.

Lives of almost **unimaginable** deprivation.

Not realistic.

unrealistic

It was unrealistic to expect changes to be made overnight.

Not capable of being imagined or grasped mentally; unbelievable.

inconceivable It seemed **inconceivable** that the president had been unaware of what

was going on.

incredible Beyond belief or understanding.

At incredible speed.

marvelous Extraordinarily good or great; used especially as intensifiers.

A marvelous collection of rare books.

of the nature of a miracle or having the power to work miracles.

I felt amazed and grateful for our **miraculous** escape.

In a remarkable and extremely lucky manner.

A shrine where people bring the sick to be **miraculously** healed.
