## Unmistakable as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Unmistakable" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “unmistakable” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Not able to be mistaken for anything else; very distinctive.*
- *Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment.*
- *Clearly evident to the mind.*



## Synonyms of "Unmistakable" as an adjective (10 Words)

- apparent**      Appearing as such but not necessarily so.  
*It became **apparent** that he was talented.*
- distinct**      (often followed by `from') not alike; different in nature or quality.  
*A **distinct** outline.*
- distinctive**      Characteristic of one person or thing, and so serving to distinguish it from others.  
*Juniper berries give gin its **distinctive** flavour.*
- evident**      Clearly seen or understood; obvious.  
***Evident** hostility.*
- manifest**      Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment.  
***Manifest** disapproval.*

<b>palpable</b>	Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment. <i>The <b>palpable</b> bump at the bridge of the nose.</i>
<b>patent</b>	Made and marketed under a patent proprietary. <i><b>Patent</b> advantages.</i>
<b>plain</b>	Lacking patterns especially in color. <i>The advantages were <b>plain</b> to see.</i>
<b>telltale</b>	Revealing, indicating, or betraying something. <i>The <b>telltale</b> bulge of a concealed weapon.</i>
<b>well defined</b>	Wise or advantageous and hence advisable.

## Usage Examples of "Unmistakable" as an adjective

- *His opposition to slavery was unmistakable.*
- *The unmistakable sound of his laughter.*

## Associations of "Unmistakable" (30 Words)

<b>apparent</b>	Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment. <i>His <b>apparent</b> lack of concern.</i>
<b>certainly</b>	Used to express complete agreement with something that has just been said. <i>She <b>certainly</b> is a hard worker.</i>
<b>certainty</b>	A person that is certain to do or win the specified thing. <i>She knew with absolute <b>certainty</b> that they were dead.</i>
<b>confirming</b>	Serving to support or corroborate.
<b>conspicuous</b>	Clearly visible. <i>He was very thin with a <b>conspicuous</b> Adam s apple.</i>
<b>convincing</b>	(of a victory or a winner) leaving no margin of doubt; clear. <i>Wales cruised to a <b>convincing</b> win over Ireland.</i>
<b>decidedly</b>	Undoubtedly; undeniably. <i>No Donna said <b>decidedly</b>.</i>
<b>definite</b>	Clearly true or real; unambiguous. <i>You re very <b>definite</b> about that.</i>
<b>definitely</b>	In a definite manner; clearly. <i>We couldn t plan to go elsewhere until we had heard from you more <b>definitely</b>.</i>

<b>demonstrable</b>	Capable of being demonstrated or proved. <i>The <b>demonstrable</b> injustices of racism.</i>
<b>evident</b>	Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment. <i>A clearly <b>evident</b> erasure in the manuscript.</i>
<b>expressly</b>	Explicitly; clearly. <i>She was <b>expressly</b> forbidden to use the stove.</i>
<b>flagrant</b>	Conspicuously and outrageously bad or reprehensible. <i>A <b>flagrant</b> violation of the law.</i>
<b>glaringly</b>	In a highly obvious or conspicuous manner. <i>The reason was <b>glaringly</b> obvious.</i>
<b>incontestable</b>	Not able to be disputed.
<b>indubitable</b>	Too obvious to be doubted. <i>An <b>indubitable</b> truth.</i>
<b>indubitably</b>	In a manner or to a degree that could not be doubted. <i>It was immediately and <b>indubitably</b> apparent that I had interrupted a scene of lovers.</i>
<b>justified</b>	Declared or made righteous in the sight of God. <i>A neatly <b>justified</b> list of names.</i>
<b>limpid</b>	(especially of writing or music) clear and accessible or melodious. <i><b>Limpid</b> blue eyes.</i>
<b>lucid</b>	Expressed clearly; easy to understand. <i>A <b>lucid</b> thinker.</i>
<b>obvious</b>	Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. <i>It was <b>obvious</b> a storm was coming in.</i>
<b>palpability</b>	The quality of being perceivable by touch.
<b>pellucid</b>	Translucently clear. <i>Mountains reflected in the <b>pellucid</b> waters.</i>
<b>perspicuity</b>	Clarity as a consequence of being perspicuous.
<b>perspicuous</b>	Clearly expressed and easily understood; lucid. <i>A <b>perspicuous</b> argument.</i>
<b>plain</b>	Unmistakably plain is often used informally for plainly. <i><b>Plain</b> water.</i>
<b>positivistic</b>	Of or relating to positivism.
<b>unambiguous</b>	Having or exhibiting a single clearly defined meaning. <i>As a horror apartheid is absolutely <b>unambiguous</b>.</i>
<b>unequivocal</b>	Clearly defined or formulated. <i>He was <b>unequivocal</b> in condemning the violence.</i>
