Unmistakable as an Adjective

Definitions of "Unmistakable" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “unmistakable” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Not able to be mistaken for anything else; very distinctive.*
- *Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment.*
- *Clearly evident to the mind.*



Synonyms of "Unmistakable" as an adjective (10 Words)

- apparent** Appearing as such but not necessarily so.
*It became **apparent** that he was talented.*
- distinct** (often followed by `from') not alike; different in nature or quality.
*A **distinct** outline.*
- distinctive** Characteristic of one person or thing, and so serving to distinguish it from others.
*Juniper berries give gin its **distinctive** flavour.*
- evident** Clearly seen or understood; obvious.
***Evident** hostility.*
- manifest** Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment.
***Manifest** disapproval.*

palpable	Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment. <i>The palpable bump at the bridge of the nose.</i>
patent	Made and marketed under a patent proprietary. <i>Patent advantages.</i>
plain	Lacking patterns especially in color. <i>The advantages were plain to see.</i>
telltale	Revealing, indicating, or betraying something. <i>The telltale bulge of a concealed weapon.</i>
well defined	Wise or advantageous and hence advisable.

Usage Examples of "Unmistakable" as an adjective

- *His opposition to slavery was unmistakable.*
- *The unmistakable sound of his laughter.*

Associations of "Unmistakable" (30 Words)

apparent	Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment. <i>His apparent lack of concern.</i>
certainly	Used to express complete agreement with something that has just been said. <i>She certainly is a hard worker.</i>
certainty	A person that is certain to do or win the specified thing. <i>She knew with absolute certainty that they were dead.</i>
confirming	Serving to support or corroborate.
conspicuous	Clearly visible. <i>He was very thin with a conspicuous Adam s apple.</i>
convincing	(of a victory or a winner) leaving no margin of doubt; clear. <i>Wales cruised to a convincing win over Ireland.</i>
decidedly	Undoubtedly; undeniably. <i>No Donna said decidedly.</i>
definite	Clearly true or real; unambiguous. <i>You re very definite about that.</i>
definitely	In a definite manner; clearly. <i>We couldn t plan to go elsewhere until we had heard from you more definitely.</i>

demonstrable	Capable of being demonstrated or proved. <i>The demonstrable injustices of racism.</i>
evident	Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment. <i>A clearly evident erasure in the manuscript.</i>
expressly	Explicitly; clearly. <i>She was expressly forbidden to use the stove.</i>
flagrant	Conspicuously and outrageously bad or reprehensible. <i>A flagrant violation of the law.</i>
glaringly	In a highly obvious or conspicuous manner. <i>The reason was glaringly obvious.</i>
incontestable	Not able to be disputed.
indubitable	Too obvious to be doubted. <i>An indubitable truth.</i>
indubitably	In a manner or to a degree that could not be doubted. <i>It was immediately and indubitably apparent that I had interrupted a scene of lovers.</i>
justified	Declared or made righteous in the sight of God. <i>A neatly justified list of names.</i>
limpid	(especially of writing or music) clear and accessible or melodious. <i>Limpid blue eyes.</i>
lucid	Expressed clearly; easy to understand. <i>A lucid thinker.</i>
obvious	Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. <i>It was obvious a storm was coming in.</i>
palpability	The quality of being perceivable by touch.
pellucid	Translucently clear. <i>Mountains reflected in the pellucid waters.</i>
perspicuity	Clarity as a consequence of being perspicuous.
perspicuous	Clearly expressed and easily understood; lucid. <i>A perspicuous argument.</i>
plain	Unmistakably plain is often used informally for plainly. <i>Plain water.</i>
positivistic	Of or relating to positivism.
unambiguous	Having or exhibiting a single clearly defined meaning. <i>As a horror apartheid is absolutely unambiguous.</i>
unequivocal	Clearly defined or formulated. <i>He was unequivocal in condemning the violence.</i>

unquestionably Without question and beyond doubt.
