plain

Lacking patterns especially in color.

The advantages were plain to see.

The **telltale** bulge of a concealed weapon.

well defined Wise or advantageous and hence advisable.

The **demonstrable** injustices of racism.

evident Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment.

A clearly **evident** erasure in the manuscript.

expressly Explicitly; clearly.

She was **expressly** forbidden to use the stove.

flagrant Conspicuously and outrageously bad or reprehensible.

A **flagrant** violation of the law.

In a highly obvious or conspicuous manner.

The reason was **glaringly** obvious.

incontestable Not able to be disputed.

indubitable Too obvious to be doubted.

An **indubitable** truth.

In a manner or to a degree that could not be doubted.

indubitably It was immediately and **indubitably** apparent that I had interrupted a

Declared or made righteous in the sight of God.

A neatly **justified** list of names.

limpid (especially of writing or music) clear and accessible or melodious.

Limpid blue eyes.

lucid Expressed clearly; easy to understand.

A **lucid** thinker.

obvious Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind.

It was **obvious** a storm was coming in.

palpability The quality of being perceivable by touch.

Translucently clear.

pellucid Mountains reflected in the pellucid waters.

perspicuity Clarity as a consequence of being perspicuous.

Clearly expressed and easily understood; lucid.

plain Unmistakably plain is often used informally for plainly.

Plain water.

positivistic Of or relating to positivism.

unambiguous Having or exhibiting a single clearly defined meaning.

As a horror apartheid is absolutely **unambiguous**.

unequivocal Clearly defined or formulated.

He was **unequivocal** in condemning the violence.
