### Definitions of "Unmotivated" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “unmotivated” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Not having interest in or enthusiasm for something, especially work or study.*
- *Without a reason or motive.*
- *Without motivation.*



## Synonyms of "Unmotivated" as an adjective (30 Words)

- capricious** Determined by chance or impulse or whim rather than by necessity or reason.  
*A **capricious** summer breeze.*
- casual** Hasty and without attention to detail; not thorough.  
*Showed a **casual** disregard for cold weather.*
- chance** Occurring or appearing or singled out by chance.  
*A **chance** occurrence.*
- cool** Inducing the impression of coolness used especially of greens and blues and violets.  
*The **cool** sound of rushing water.*
- detached** Not fixed in position.  
*A **detached** part.*

<b>disinterested</b>	Not influenced by considerations of personal advantage. <i>A banker is under an obligation to give <b>disinterested</b> advice.</i>
<b>dispassionate</b>	Unaffected by strong emotion or prejudice. <i>A journalist should be a <b>dispassionate</b> reporter of fact.</i>
<b>emotionless</b>	Not showing any emotion; unemotional. <i>Her voice was flat and <b>emotionless</b>.</i>
<b><u>erratic</u></b>	Having no fixed course. <i>An <b>erratic</b> comet.</i>
<b>half-hearted</b>	Feeling or showing little interest or enthusiasm.
<b><u>haphazard</u></b>	Dependent upon or characterized by chance. <i>A most <b>haphazard</b> system of record keeping.</i>
<b>impassive</b>	Deliberately impassive in manner. <i>His cold <b>impassive</b> face.</i>
<b>inconsistent</b>	Displaying a lack of consistency. <i><b>Inconsistent</b> with the roadmap.</i>
<b>indifferent</b>	Lacking importance; not mattering one way or the other. <i><b>Indifferent</b> about which book you would give them.</i>
<b><u>lackadaisical</u></b>	Idle or indolent especially in a dreamy way- P.G.Wodehouse. <i>She was annoyingly <b>lackadaisical</b> and impractical.</i>
<b>lukewarm</b>	Moderately warm. <i>Gave only <b>lukewarm</b> support to the candidate.</i>
<b>non-committal</b>	Refusing to bind oneself to a particular course of action or view or the like.
<b><u>passive</u></b>	Expressing that the subject of the sentence is the patient of the action denoted by the verb. <i>Academics seem to favor <b>passive</b> sentences.</i>
<b>random</b>	Governed by or involving equal chances for each item. <i>Bombs fell at <b>random</b>.</i>
<b><u>uncaring</u></b>	Lacking affection or warm feeling. <i>An <b>uncaring</b> person.</i>
<b><u>unconcerned</u></b>	Showing a lack of worry or interest, especially when this is surprising or callous. <i>Readers <b>unconcerned</b> with style.</i>
<b><u>unemotional</u></b>	Cool and formal in manner. <i>A flat <b>unemotional</b> voice.</i>
<b>unfeeling</b>	Devoid of feeling for others. <i>An <b>unfeeling</b> wretch.</i>

<b>uninterested</b>	Having no care or interest in knowing. <i>I was totally <b>uninterested</b> in boys.</i>
<b><u>uninvolved</u></b>	Not connected or concerned with someone or something, especially on an emotional level. <i>An <b>uninvolved</b> bystander.</i>
<b>unmoved</b>	Emotionally unmoved. <i>Always appeared completely <b>unmoved</b> and imperturbable.</i>
<b><u>unpredictable</u></b>	Not capable of being foretold. <i>An <b>unpredictable</b> or indeterminable future.</i>
<b><u>unresponsive</u></b>	Not responding to some influence or stimulus. <i>Was <b>unresponsive</b> to her passionate advances.</i>
<b><u>whimsical</u></b>	Determined by chance or impulse or whim rather than by necessity or reason. <i>The <b>whimsical</b> arbitrariness of autocracy.</i>
<b>wild</b>	Produced from wild animals or plants without cultivation. <i>A <b>wild</b> guess.</i>
