- *Without a reason or motive.*
- *Without motivation.*



Synonyms of "Unmotivated" as an adjective (30 Words)

- capricious** Determined by chance or impulse or whim rather than by necessity or reason.
*A **capricious** summer breeze.*
- casual** Hasty and without attention to detail; not thorough.
*Showed a **casual** disregard for cold weather.*
- chance** Occurring or appearing or singled out by chance.
*A **chance** occurrence.*
- cool** Inducing the impression of coolness used especially of greens and blues and violets.
*The **cool** sound of rushing water.*
- detached** Not fixed in position.
*A **detached** part.*

disinterested	Not influenced by considerations of personal advantage. <i>A banker is under an obligation to give disinterested advice.</i>
dispassionate	Unaffected by strong emotion or prejudice. <i>A journalist should be a dispassionate reporter of fact.</i>
emotionless	Not showing any emotion; unemotional. <i>Her voice was flat and emotionless.</i>
<u>erratic</u>	Having no fixed course. <i>An erratic comet.</i>
half-hearted	Feeling or showing little interest or enthusiasm.
<u>haphazard</u>	Dependent upon or characterized by chance. <i>A most haphazard system of record keeping.</i>
impassive	Deliberately impassive in manner. <i>His cold impassive face.</i>
inconsistent	Displaying a lack of consistency. <i>Inconsistent with the roadmap.</i>
indifferent	Lacking importance; not mattering one way or the other. <i>Indifferent about which book you would give them.</i>
<u>lackadaisical</u>	Idle or indolent especially in a dreamy way- P.G.Wodehouse. <i>She was annoyingly lackadaisical and impractical.</i>
lukewarm	Moderately warm. <i>Gave only lukewarm support to the candidate.</i>
non-committal	Refusing to bind oneself to a particular course of action or view or the like.
<u>passive</u>	Expressing that the subject of the sentence is the patient of the action denoted by the verb. <i>Academics seem to favor passive sentences.</i>
random	Governed by or involving equal chances for each item. <i>Bombs fell at random.</i>
<u>uncaring</u>	Lacking affection or warm feeling. <i>An uncaring person.</i>
<u>unconcerned</u>	Showing a lack of worry or interest, especially when this is surprising or callous. <i>Readers unconcerned with style.</i>
<u>unemotional</u>	Cool and formal in manner. <i>A flat unemotional voice.</i>
unfeeling	Devoid of feeling for others. <i>An unfeeling wretch.</i>

uninterested	Having no care or interest in knowing. <i>I was totally uninterested in boys.</i>
<u>uninvolved</u>	Not connected or concerned with someone or something, especially on an emotional level. <i>An uninvolved bystander.</i>
unmoved	Emotionally unmoved. <i>Always appeared completely unmoved and imperturbable.</i>
<u>unpredictable</u>	Not capable of being foretold. <i>An unpredictable or indeterminable future.</i>
<u>unresponsive</u>	Not responding to some influence or stimulus. <i>Was unresponsive to her passionate advances.</i>
<u>whimsical</u>	Determined by chance or impulse or whim rather than by necessity or reason. <i>The whimsical arbitrariness of autocracy.</i>
wild	Produced from wild animals or plants without cultivation. <i>A wild guess.</i>

Usage Examples of "Unmotivated" as an adjective
