**all right**

Quantifier; used with either mass or count nouns to indicate the whole number or amount of or every one of a class.

<b>average</b>	Approximating the statistical norm or average or expected value. <i>A novel of <b>average</b> merit.</i>
<b>characterless</b>	Lacking distinct or individual characteristics; dull and uninteresting.
<b>common</b>	Having no special distinction or quality widely known or commonly encountered average or ordinary or usual. <i>The <b>common</b> man.</i>
<b>commonplace</b>	Not unusual; ordinary. <i><b>Commonplace</b> everyday activities.</i>
<b><u>everyday</u></b>	Happening or used every day; daily. <i>The familiar <b>everyday</b> world.</i>
<b>fair</b>	Not excessive or extreme. <i>He s very <b>fair</b> with blue eyes.</i>
<b>featureless</b>	Lacking distinguishing characteristics or features. <i>The <b>featureless</b> landscape of the steppe.</i>
<b>forgettable</b>	Easily forgotten, especially through being uninteresting or mediocre. <i>Eminently <b>forgettable</b> horror movies.</i>
<b>humdrum</b>	Not challenging; dull and lacking excitement. <i>A <b>humdrum</b> existence all work and no play.</i>
<b><u>inconsequential</u></b>	Lacking worth or importance. <i>His work seems trivial and <b>inconsequential</b>.</i>
<b><u>inconspicuous</u></b>	Not clearly visible or attracting attention. <i>He pushed the string through an <b>inconspicuous</b> hole.</i>
<b>indifferent</b>	Neither good nor bad; mediocre. <i>What others think is altogether <b>indifferent</b> to him.</i>
<b>lacklustre</b>	Lacking brilliance or vitality. <i>The conditioner will revitalize <b>lacklustre</b> hair.</i>
<b>mediocre</b>	Moderate to inferior in quality. <i>The caliber of the students has gone from <b>mediocre</b> to above average.</i>
<b>middle-of-the-road</b>	Not extreme, especially in political views.
<b>middling</b>	Lacking exceptional quality or ability. <i>The performance was <b>middling</b> at best.</i>
<b>moderate</b>	(of a person, party, or policy) not radical or excessively right- or left-wing. <i>A <b>moderate</b> penalty.</i>
<b><u>mundane</u></b>	Concerned with the world or worldly matters. <i>His <b>mundane</b> humdrum existence.</i>

<b>nondescript</b>	Lacking distinctive or interesting features or characteristics. <i>A <b>nondescript</b> novel.</i>
<b>not bad</b>	Below average in quality or performance.
<b><u>obscure</u></b>	Remote and separate physically or socially- W.H.Hudson. <i>An <b>obscure</b> retreat.</i>
<b>ordinary</b>	With no special or distinctive features; normal. <i>The <b>ordinary</b> or common man in the street.</i>
<b>passable</b>	Able to be passed or traversed or crossed. <i>He spoke <b>passable</b> English.</i>
<b><u>pedestrian</u></b>	Lacking inspiration or excitement; dull. <i>Disenchantment with their <b>pedestrian</b> lives.</i>
<b>plain</b>	Not using concealment or deception; frank. <i>A <b>plain</b> girl with a freckled face.</i>
<b>prosaic</b>	Not challenging; dull and lacking excitement. <i><b>Prosaic</b> language can't convey the experience.</i>
<b>quotidian</b>	Ordinary or everyday; mundane. <i>There's nothing quite like a real train conductor to add color to a <b>quotidian</b> commute.</i>
<b>run-of-the-mill</b>	Not special in any way.
<b>simple</b>	(of a leaf or stem) not divided or branched. <i>A <b>simple</b> design.</i>
<b>suburban</b>	Of or characteristic of a suburb. <i>Elizabeth despised Ann's house proudness as deeply <b>suburban</b>.</i>
<b><u>uneventful</u></b>	Marked by no noteworthy or significant events. <i>A place where dull people lead <b>uneventful</b> lives.</i>
<b>unexceptional</b>	Not special in any way. <i>A <b>unexceptional</b> incident as can be found in a lawyer's career.</i>
<b>unexciting</b>	Not stimulating. <i>Many school prospectuses are dull and <b>unexciting</b>.</i>
<b><u>unimpressive</u></b>	Not capable of impressing. <i>He was a man of <b>unimpressive</b> appearance.</i>
<b>uninspired</b>	Having no intellectual or emotional or spiritual excitement. <i>He writes repetitive and <b>uninspired</b> poetry.</i>
<b>unmemorable</b>	Not memorable. <i>Characterless boring <b>unmemorable</b> buildings.</i>
<b><u>unremarkable</u></b>	Found in the ordinary course of events. <i>An <b>unremarkable</b> house.</i>

<b>unspectacular</b>	Not spectacular. <i>She had been an <b>unspectacular</b> student.</i>
<b>workaday</b>	Relating to work or one's job. <i>Your humble <b>workaday</b> PC.</i>

- *The reverberation will be so slight as to be unnoticeable.*
- *An unnoticeable cigarette burn on the carpet.*

<b>abstruse</b>	Difficult to penetrate; incomprehensible to one of ordinary understanding or knowledge. <i>The professor's lectures were so <b>abstruse</b> that students tended to avoid them.</i>
<b>blur</b>	Make unclear indistinct or blurred. <i>The haze <b>blurs</b> the hills.</i>
<b>concealed</b>	Hidden on any grounds for any motive. <i>He spoke with barely <b>concealed</b> anger.</i>
<b>dim</b>	Make dim or lusterless. <i>The lights <b>dimmed</b> and the curtains parted.</i>
<b>disappear</b>	Become invisible or unnoticeable. <i>The tension had completely <b>disappeared</b>.</i>
<b>elusive</b>	Making great mental demands; hard to comprehend or solve or believe. <i>The <b>elusive</b> thought he had had moments before.</i>
<b>esoteric</b>	Intended for or likely to be understood by only a small number of people with a specialized knowledge or interest. <i>A compilation of <b>esoteric</b> philosophical theories.</i>
<b>faint</b>	Lacking strength or vigor. <i>I <b>fainted</b> from loss of blood.</i>
<b>hidden</b>	Kept out of sight; concealed. <i><b>Hidden</b> valleys.</i>
<b>hide</b>	Prevent (an emotion or fact) from being apparent or known; keep secret. <i>Juliet's first instinct was to <b>hide</b> under the blankets.</i>
<b>inconspicuous</b>	Not prominent or readily noticeable. <i>He pushed the string through an <b>inconspicuous</b> hole.</i>

<b>indefinite</b>	Vague or not clearly defined or stated. <i>An <b>indefinite</b> number of generations.</i>
<b>indistinct</b>	Not clearly defined or easy to perceive or understand. <i>His speech was slurred and <b>indistinct</b>.</i>
<u><b>invisible</b></u>	Invisible exports and imports. <i><b>Invisible</b> mending.</i>
<u><b>obscure</b></u>	Make obscure or unclear. <i>An <b>obscure</b> flaw.</i>
<u><b>opaque</b></u>	A substance for producing opaque areas on negatives. <i>Bottles filled with a pale <b>opaque</b> liquid.</i>
<b>recondite</b>	Difficult to penetrate; incomprehensible to one of ordinary understanding or knowledge. <i>The book is full of <b>recondite</b> information.</i>
<u><b>secrecy</b></u>	The condition of being concealed or hidden. <i>The bidding is conducted in <b>secrecy</b>.</i>
<u><b>silent</b></u>	Marked by absence of sound. <i>A <b>silent</b> house.</i>
<u><b>subtlety</b></u>	A subtle difference in meaning or opinion or attitude. <i>You had to admire the <b>subtlety</b> of the distinctions he drew.</i>
<u><b>trivia</b></u>	Something of small importance. <i>We fill our days with meaningless <b>trivia</b>.</i>
<u><b>ulterior</b></u>	Lying beyond what is openly revealed or avowed (especially being kept in the background or deliberately concealed). <i>Without <b>ulterior</b> argument.</i>
<u><b>unappreciated</b></u>	Not fully understood, recognized, or valued. <i>She had been brought up in a family where she felt <b>unappreciated</b> and undervalued.</i>
<u><b>unclear</b></u>	Not easy to see, hear, or understand. <i>The motive for this killing is <b>unclear</b>.</i>
<b>undistinguished</b>	Not special in any way; lacking distinction. <i>An <b>undistinguished</b> career.</i>
<b>unknown</b>	An unknown quantity or variable. <i>Find the <b>unknown</b> in the following equations.</i>
<u><b>unobtrusive</b></u>	Not obtrusive or undesirably noticeable. <i>A quiet <b>unobtrusive</b> life of self denial.</i>
<u><b>unseen</b></u>	An unseen passage for translation. <i>It seemed she might escape <b>unseen</b>.</i>
