- concealed** Hidden on any grounds for any motive.  
*A **concealed** compartment in his briefcase.*
- discreet** Intentionally unobtrusive.  
*A **discreet** investor.*
- hidden** Kept out of sight; concealed.  
***Hidden** dangers.*
- modest** Marked by simplicity; having a humble opinion of yourself.  
*The **modest** women wear long sleeved dresses and all but cover their faces.*
- unassuming** Not arrogant or presuming.  
*He was an **unassuming** and kindly man.*

<b>undistinguished</b>	Not worthy of notice. <i>An <b>undistinguished</b> career.</i>
<b>unexceptional</b>	Not out of the ordinary; usual. <i>A <b>unexceptional</b> incident as can be found in a lawyer's career.</i>
<b>unimposing</b>	Lacking in impressiveness. <i>A handsome but <b>unimposing</b> Georgian house.</i>
<b>unnoticeable</b>	Not easily observed or noticed. <i>Her clothes were simple and <b>unnoticeable</b>.</i>
<b>unobtrusive</b>	Not conspicuous or attracting attention. <i>The service was <b>unobtrusive</b> and efficient.</i>
<b>unostentatious</b>	Exhibiting restrained good taste. <i><b>Unostentatious</b> elegance.</i>
<b>unremarkable</b>	Found in the ordinary course of events. <i>An <b>unremarkable</b> house.</i>
<b>unspectacular</b>	Not spectacular. <i>She had been an <b>unspectacular</b> student.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Unnoticed" as an adjective

- *A deliberate kick that went unnoticed by the referee.*

- *Hoped his departure had passed unnoticed.*



## Associations of "Unnoticed" (30 Words)

<b><u>adverse</u></b>	Preventing success or development; harmful; unfavourable. <i><b>Adverse</b> weather conditions.</i>
<b>blithe</b>	Happy or carefree. <i>A <b>blithe</b> disregard for the rules of the road.</i>
<b>condone</b>	Excuse, overlook, or make allowances for; be lenient with. <i>The college cannot <b>condone</b> any behaviour that involves illicit drugs.</i>
<b>connive</b>	Secretly allow (something immoral, illegal, or harmful) to occur. <i>She <b>connived</b> with a senior official to rig the results of last year's election.</i>
<b><u>disregard</u></b>	Lack of attention and due care. <i>The body of evidence is too substantial to <b>disregard</b>.</i>
<b><u>evade</u></b>	Practice evasion. <i>They tend to <b>evade</b> their responsibilities.</i>
<b>eye</b>	A rounded eye like marking on an animal such as those on the tail of a peacock an eyespot. <i>Her <b>eyes</b> were swollen with crying.</i>

<b><u>forget</u></b>	Forget to do something. <i>Don't <b>forget</b> to call the chairman of the board to the meeting.</i>
<b><u>invisible</u></b>	Invisible exports and imports. <i><b>Invisible</b> mending.</i>
<b>lifeboat</b>	A strong sea boat designed to rescue people from a sinking ship.
<b><u>lighthearted</u></b>	Carefree and happy and lighthearted. <i>Her <b>lighthearted</b> nature.</i>
<b><u>neglect</u></b>	The trait of neglecting responsibilities and lacking concern. <i>He <b>neglected</b> to write to her.</i>
<b>offstage</b>	Not in public. <i>The <b>offstage</b> lives of celebrities.</i>
<b><u>overlook</u></b>	Look past, fail to notice. <i>He was <b>overlooking</b> his harvest men.</i>
<b><u>remaining</u></b>	Not used up. <i>England have forbidden him to play in the <b>remaining</b> fixtures.</i>
<b>sight</b>	Take aim by looking through the sights of a gun or other device. <i>A <b>sight</b> test.</i>
<b><u>sneer</u></b>	A facial expression of contempt or scorn; the upper lip curls. <i>She <b>sneered</b> at her little sister's efforts to play the song on the piano.</i>
<b>soundproof</b>	Impervious to, or not penetrable by, sound. <i>A <b>soundproof</b> windowless room.</i>
<b><u>survivor</u></b>	A person who copes well with difficulties in their life. <i>The <b>survivors</b> of the fire were taken to a hospital.</i>
<b><u>undeserved</u></b>	Not warranted, merited, or earned. <i>Has an <b>undeserved</b> reputation as a coward.</i>
<b><u>undetected</u></b>	Not perceived or discerned. <i>The thieves escaped <b>undetected</b>.</i>
<b>undiagnosed</b>	Eluding diagnosis. <i>Some patients have diseases that go <b>undiagnosed</b> and therefore untreated.</i>
<b><u>undiscovered</u></b>	Not discovered. <i><b>Undiscovered</b> islands.</i>
<b><u>unexpected</u></b>	Not expected or regarded as likely to happen. <i>He seemed to have a knack for saying the <b>unexpected</b>.</i>
<b>unknown</b>	An unknown quantity or variable. <i>Find the <b>unknown</b> in the following equations.</i>
<b><u>unnamed</u></b>	Being or having an unknown or unnamed source. <i>The <b>unnamed</b> man was found unconscious.</i>

- unobserved** Not observed.  
*Managed to slip away **unobserved**.*
- unpropitious** (of a circumstance) not giving or indicating a good chance of success;  
unfavourable.  
*His reports were submitted at a financially **unpropitious** time.*
- unseen** An unseen passage for translation.  
*It seemed she might escape **unseen**.*
- untoward** Not in keeping with accepted standards of what is right or proper in polite society.  
***Untoward** remarks.*
