
Unobtainable as an Adjective

- Not able to be obtained.
- Not capable of being obtained.





Synonyms of "Unobtainable" as an adjective (10 Words)

hopelessWithout hope because there seems to be no possibility of comfort or
success.
She handed me a hopeless jumble of papers.



implausible	Having a quality that provokes disbelief. Gave the teacher an implausible excuse.
impracticable	Not capable of being carried out or put into practice. <i>Refloating the sunken ship proved</i> impracticable because of its fragility.
<u>impractical</u>	(of a person) not skilled or interested in doing practical work. An impractical solution.
inaccessible	Unable to be used. High culture is largely inaccessible to the masses.
unachievable	Impossible to achieve. An unachievable political goal.
<u>unattainable</u>	Impossible to achieve. An unattainable goal.
unprocurable	Not capable of being obtained.
<u>untouchable</u>	Of or belonging to the lowest-caste Hindu group or the people outside the caste system. Drug barons who were legally untouchable .
unworkable	Not able to function or be carried out successfully; impractical. <i>The alloy becomes brittle and almost</i> unworkable .

Usage Examples of "Unobtainable" as an adjective

- The book was unobtainable in London so I wrote to the publisher.
- Timber is virtually unobtainable in the islands.
