circumspect	Heedful of potential consequences. <i>Physicians are now more circumspect about recommending its use</i>
demure	Reserved, modest, and shy (typically used of a woman. Antonia was pensive and <b>demure</b> .
<u>discreet</u>	Intentionally unobtrusive. A <b>discreet</b> investor.
downbeat	Relaxed and understated. The assessment of the UK s economic prospects is <b>downbeat</b> .
humble	Of low social, administrative, or political rank. <i>Of <b>humble</b> or lowly birth.</i>
in the background	Currently fashionable.
<u>inconspicuous</u>	Not prominent or readily noticeable. An <b>inconspicuous</b> red brick building.



low-key	Restrained in style or quality.
<u>meek</u>	Evidencing little spirit or courage; overly submissive or compliant. <i>Meek</i> as a mouse.
<u>modest</u>	Unassuming in the estimation of one's abilities or achievements. It was a nice wedding necessarily <b>modest</b> .
muted	(of colour or lighting) not bright; subdued. <i>Muted</i> anger.
out of sight	Not allowed to continue to bat or run.
quiet	Expressed in a restrained or understated way. <i>Quiet</i> peace loving people.
relaxed	Without strain or anxiety. Gave the impression of being quite <b>relaxed</b> .
restrained	(of colour, decoration, etc.) not excessively showy or ornate; understated. The head and chest injuries that even <b>restrained</b> drivers can suffer through impact with the steering wheel.
retiring	Not arrogant or presuming. A <b>retiring</b> member of the board.
self-effacing	Reluctant to draw attention to yourself.
subdued	Not brilliant or glaring. <i>Subdued</i> lighting.
<u>subtle</u>	Crafty; cunning. His whole attitude had undergone a <b>subtle</b> change.
<u>unassuming</u>	Not arrogant or presuming. <b>Unassuming</b> to a fault skeptical about the value of his work.
<u>understated</u>	Presented or expressed in a subtle and effective way. <b>Understated</b> elegance.
<u>unnoticeable</u>	Not obtrusive or undesirably noticeable. <i>The reverberation will be so slight as to be <b>unnoticeable</b>.</i>
unostentatious	Exhibiting restrained good taste. <i>He was generous in a quiet <b>unostentatious</b> way.</i>
unshowy	Not showy in appearance or style; restrained or understated. She writes about her parents with deep <b>unshowy</b> affection.

cagey	Characterized by great caution and wariness. A <b>cagey</b> avoidance of a definite answer.
<u>careful</u>	Full of cares or anxiety. I begged him to be more <b>careful</b> .
concealed	Not accessible to view. A <b>concealed</b> weapon.
<u>covered</u>	Overlaid or spread or topped with or enclosed within something; sometimes used as a combining form. A <b>covered</b> balcony.



dumb	Make dumb or unheard silence. A <b>dumb</b> question.
<u>hidden</u>	Kept out of sight; concealed. <i>Her <b>hidden</b> feelings.</i>
hide	Be or go into hiding; keep out of sight, as for protection and safety. <i>Hide</i> the money.
inarticulate	Unable to express one's ideas or feelings clearly or easily. Mention of her mother filled her with <b>inarticulate</b> irritation.
inaudible	Unable to be heard. <i>Inaudible</i> pulses of high frequency sound.
incommunicado	Not able, wanting, or allowed to communicate with other people. They were separated and detained <b>incommunicado</b> .
inconspicuous	Not clearly visible or attracting attention. <i>He pushed the string through an <b>inconspicuous</b> hole.</i>
<u>invisible</u>	Invisible exports and imports. Before 1971 women artists were pretty well <b>invisible</b> .
modesty	Behaviour, manner, or appearance intended to avoid impropriety or indecency. <i>Modesty</i> forbade her to undress in front of so many people.
mute	Muffle the sound of a musical instrument especially by the use of a mute. Harry sat <b>mute</b> his cheeks burning resentfully.
muted	(of colour or lighting) not bright; subdued. A dress in <b>muted</b> tones of powder blue and dusty pink.
<u>obscure</u>	Make obscure or unclear. The distinction was <b>obscure</b> d.
quiet	With little or no activity or no agitation quiet is a nonstandard variant for quietly. The factions remained <b>quiet</b> for almost 10 years.
reticence	The quality of being reticent; reserve. The traditional emotional <b>reticence</b> of the British.
<u>reticent</u>	Reluctant to draw attention to yourself. She was extremely <b>reticent</b> about her personal affairs.
<u>secrecy</u>	The trait of keeping things secret. <i>The bidding is conducted in <b>secrecy</b>.</i>
<u>silent</u>	Implied by or inferred from actions or statements. The <b>silent</b> h at the beginning of honor.



<u>speechless</u>	Temporarily incapable of speaking. <i>He was <b>speechless</b> with rage.</i>
sucker	Of a plant produce suckers. The <b>sucker</b> s run along each tentacle.
<u>tacit</u>	Implied by or inferred from actions or statements. Your silence may be taken to mean <b>tacit</b> agreement.
uncharacteristically	In a way that is not typical of a particular person or thing. <i>He hesitated <b>uncharacteristically</b>.</i>
undistinguished	Not special in any way; lacking distinction. An <b>undistinguished</b> career.
<u>unnoticeable</u>	Not drawing attention. <i>Her clothes were simple and <b>unnoticeable</b>.</i>
<u>unseen</u>	An unseen passage for translation. <b>Unseen</b> forces at work.
unutterable	Defying expression or description. Moments of <b>unutterable</b> grief.
wordless	Expressed without speech- Emily Dickinson- Thomas Wolfe. A sort of <b>wordless</b> communication had developed.
