modest Unassuming in the estimation of one's abilities or achievements.

It was a nice wedding necessarily **modest**.

muted (of colour or lighting) not bright; subdued.

Muted anger.

out of sight Not allowed to continue to bat or run.

quiet Expressed in a restrained or understated way.

Quiet peace loving people.

relaxed Without strain or anxiety.

Gave the impression of being quite **relaxed**.

(of colour, decoration, etc.) not excessively showy or ornate;

understated.

restrained
The head and chest injuries that even restrained drivers can suffer

through impact with the steering wheel.

retiring Not arrogant or presuming.

A **retiring** member of the board.

self-effacing Reluctant to draw attention to yourself.

subdued Not brilliant or glaring.

Subdued lighting.

subtle Crafty; cunning.

His whole attitude had undergone a **subtle** change.

. Not arrogant or presuming.

unassuming Unassuming to a fault skeptical about the value of his work.

Presented or expressed in a subtle and effective way.

understated Understated elegance.

unnoticeable Not obtrusive or undesirably noticeable.

The reverberation will be so slight as to be **unnoticeable**.

unostentatious Exhibiting restrained good taste.

He was generous in a quiet **unostentatious** way.

unshowyNot showy in appearance or style; restrained or understated.

Shownites about her parents with deep week own affection.

She writes about her parents with deep **unshowy** affection.

Not clearly visible or attracting attention. inconspicuous

He pushed the string through an **inconspicuous** hole.

Invisible exports and imports. **invisible**

Before 1971 women artists were pretty well **invisible**.

Behaviour, manner, or appearance intended to avoid impropriety or

indecency. modesty

Modesty forbade her to undress in front of so many people.

Muffle the sound of a musical instrument especially by the use of a

mute mute.

Harry sat **mute** his cheeks burning resentfully.

(of colour or lighting) not bright; subdued. muted

A dress in **muted** tones of powder blue and dusty pink.

Make obscure or unclear. **obscure**

The distinction was **obscure**d.

With little or no activity or no agitation quiet is a nonstandard

variant for quietly. quiet

The factions remained **quiet** for almost 10 years.

The quality of being reticent; reserve. reticence

The traditional emotional **reticence** of the British.

Reluctant to draw attention to yourself.

reticent She was extremely **reticent** about her personal affairs.

The trait of keeping things secret.

secrecy The bidding is conducted in **secrecy**.

Implied by or inferred from actions or statements.

silent The **silent** h at the beginning of honor.



speechless Temporarily incapable of speaking.

He was **speechless** with rage.

sucker Of a plant produce suckers.

The **sucker**s run along each tentacle.

tacit Implied by or inferred from actions or statements.

Your silence may be taken to mean **tacit** agreement.

uncharacteristically In a way that is not typical of a particular person or thing.

He hesitated uncharacteristically.

undistinguished

Not special in any way; lacking distinction.

An undistinguished career.

unnoticeable Not drawing attention.

Her clothes were simple and unnoticeable.

An unseen passage for translation.

Unseen forces at work.

unutterable Defying expression or description.

Moments of unutterable grief.

wordless Expressed without speech- Emily Dickinson- Thomas Wolfe.

A sort of **wordless** communication had developed.
