- casual** Not showing effort or strain.  
A *casual* meeting.
- disorganized** Lacking order or methodical arrangement or function.  
A thousand pages of muddy and *disorganized* prose.
- haphazard** Marked by great carelessness.  
A *haphazard* plan of action.
- heedless** Marked by or paying little heed or attention-Franklin D. Roosevelt.  
His *heedless* impetuosity.
- lackadaisical** Idle or indolent especially in a dreamy way- P.G.Wodehouse.  
A *lackadaisical* spiritless young man about town.
- last-minute** Just before a deadline at the last minute.

<b><u>lax</u></b>	Of a speech sound especially a vowel pronounced with the vocal muscles relaxed. <i><b>Lax</b> in attending classes.</i>
<b><u>messy</u></b>	(of a situation) confused and difficult to deal with. <i>His <b>messy</b> hair.</i>
<b>neglectful</b>	Not giving proper care or attention to someone or something. <i><b>Neglectful</b> of his duties.</i>
<b>negligent</b>	Characterized by neglect and undue lack of concern. <i>The council had been <b>negligent</b> in its supervision of the children in care.</i>
<b>nonunionised</b>	Not affiliated in a trade union.
<b>nonunionized</b>	Not affiliated in a trade union.
<b>offhand</b>	Casually thoughtless or inconsiderate. <i>She treated most men with <b>offhand</b> contempt.</i>
<b><u>remiss</u></b>	Lacking care or attention to duty; negligent. <i><b>Remiss</b> of you not to pay your bills.</i>
<b>slack</b>	Not tense or taut. <i>They were working at a <b>slack</b> pace.</i>
<b>slapdash</b>	Done too hurriedly and carelessly. <i>He gave a <b>slapdash</b> performance.</i>
<b>slovenly</b>	(especially of a person or action) careless; excessively casual. <i><b>Slovenly</b> speech.</i>
<b><u>thoughtless</u></b>	Showing lack of careful thought. <i>It was <b>thoughtless</b> of her to have rushed out and not said where she would be going.</i>
<b>unmethodical</b>	Not efficient or methodical. <i>His inability to locate the source of the trouble resulted in <b>unmethodical</b> chaos.</i>
<b>unorganised</b>	Not affiliated in a trade union.
<b>unsystematic</b>	Not done or acting according to a fixed plan or system; unmethodical. <i>He works in an <b>unsystematic</b> manner.</i>
<b>untidy</b>	Not neat and tidy. <i><b>Untidy</b> and casual about money.</i>

<b><u>amorphous</u></b>	(of a solid) not crystalline, or not apparently crystalline. <i>An <b>amorphous</b> mineral.</i>
<b>autonomous</b>	(in Kantian moral philosophy) acting in accordance with one's moral duty rather than one's desires. <i>An <b>autonomous</b> judiciary.</i>
<b>development</b>	A district that has been developed to serve some purpose. <i>The latest <b>developments</b> in information technology.</i>
<b>each</b>	Every one considered individually. <i>They received 10 <b>each</b>.</i>
<b>egocentrism</b>	Concern for your own interests and welfare.
<b>egotist</b>	A conceited and self-centered person. <i>He is a self absorbed <b>egotist</b>.</i>
<b>entity</b>	Existence; being. <i><b>Entity</b> and nonentity.</i>
<b>free</b>	Free from obligations or duties. <i>She was always <b>free</b> with her money.</i>
<b>freelancer</b>	A writer or artist who sells services to different employers without a long-term contract with any of them.
<b>growth</b>	Something grown or growing. <i>The method enables doctors to distinguish between malignant and benign <b>growths</b>.</i>
<b>illimitable</b>	Without limits or an end. <i>The <b>illimitable</b> human capacity for evil.</i>
<b>independence</b>	The fact or state of being independent. <i>I've always valued my <b>independence</b>.</i>
<b>independent</b>	An independent political candidate. <i>The <b>independent</b> candidate.</i>
<b>independently</b>	On your own; without outside help. <i>The figures have been <b>independently</b> audited.</i>

<b>individual</b>	Separate and distinct from others of the same kind. <i>Mark the <b>individual</b> pages.</i>
<b><u>initiative</u></b>	An act or strategy intended to resolve a difficulty or improve a situation; a fresh approach to something. <i>Anti hunting groups have seized the <b>initiative</b> in the dispute.</i>
<b>irrespective</b>	Not taking (something) into account; regardless of. <i>Child benefit is paid <b>irrespective</b> of income levels.</i>
<b>nationalist</b>	Relating to nationalists or nationalism. <i>Minor <b>nationalistic</b> differences.</i>
<b><u>secede</u></b>	Withdraw from an organization or communion. <i>The kingdom of Belgium <b>seceded</b> from the Netherlands in 1830.</i>
<b>separatist</b>	Relating to separatists or separatism. <i>Religious <b>separatists</b>.</i>
<b>unaided</b>	Carried out without aid or assistance. <i>His first <b>unaided</b> walk through the park.</i>
<b><u>unbridled</u></b>	Uncontrolled; unconstrained. <i><b>Unbridled</b> lust.</i>
<b><u>unchecked</u></b>	Not restrained or controlled. <i>Prices rose <b>unchecked</b> hitting the poor worst of all.</i>
<b>unfettered</b>	Not bound by shackles and chains. <i><b>Unfettered</b> artistic genius.</i>
<b>unformed</b>	Not having form or shape. <i>An as yet <b>unformed</b> government.</i>
<b>unlimited</b>	Having no limits in range or scope. <i>Offshore reserves of gas and oil are not <b>unlimited</b>.</i>
<b>unrestricted</b>	Not subject to or subjected to restriction. <i><b>Unrestricted</b> verbs are usually stronger than those qualified by adverbs.</i>
<b>wild</b>	A wild primitive state untouched by civilization. <i>He lived in the <b>wild</b>.</i>
<b><u>yet</u></b>	Used after a superlative. <i>The largest drug bust <b>yet</b>.</i>
