<u>careless</u>	Marked by lack of attention or consideration or forethought or thoroughness; not careful. <i>Careless</i> proofreading.
<u>casual</u>	Not showing effort or strain. A casual meeting.
<u>disorganized</u>	Lacking order or methodical arrangement or function. A thousand pages of muddy and disorganized prose.
<u>haphazard</u>	Marked by great carelessness. A haphazard plan of action.
heedless	Marked by or paying little heed or attention-Franklin D. Roosevelt. <i>His heedless impetuosity.</i>
<u>lackadaisical</u>	Idle or indolent especially in a dreamy way- P.G.Wodehouse. A lackadaisical spiritless young man about town.
last-minute	Just before a deadline at the last minute.



lax	Of a speech sound especially a vowel pronounced with the vocal muscles relaxed. <i>Lax in attending classes.</i>
<u>messy</u>	(of a situation) confused and difficult to deal with. <i>His messy hair.</i>
neglectful	Not giving proper care or attention to someone or something. <i>Neglectful of his duties.</i>
negligent	Characterized by neglect and undue lack of concern. The council had been negligent in its supervision of the children in care.
nonunionised	Not affiliated in a trade union.
nonunionized	Not affiliated in a trade union.
offhand	Casually thoughtless or inconsiderate. She treated most men with offhand contempt.
<u>remiss</u>	Lacking care or attention to duty; negligent. Remiss of you not to pay your bills.
slack	Not tense or taut. They were working at a slack pace.
slapdash	Done too hurriedly and carelessly. <i>He gave a slapdash performance.</i>
slovenly	(especially of a person or action) careless; excessively casual. <i>Slovenly speech</i> .
<u>thoughtless</u>	Showing lack of careful thought. It was thoughtless of her to have rushed out and not said where she would be going.
unmethodical	Not efficient or methodical. <i>His inability to locate the source of the trouble resulted in</i> unmethodical <i>chaos.</i>
unorganised	Not affiliated in a trade union.
unsystematic	Not done or acting according to a fixed plan or system; unmethodical. <i>He works in an unsystematic manner.</i>
untidy	Not neat and tidy. Untidy and casual about money.

<u>secede</u>	Withdraw from an organization or communion. The kingdom of Belgium secede d from the Netherlands in 1830.
separatist	Relating to separatists or separatism. <i>Religious separatists.</i>
unaided	Carried out without aid or assistance. His first unaided walk through the park.
<u>unbridled</u>	Uncontrolled; unconstrained. Unbridled lust.
<u>unchecked</u>	Not restrained or controlled. Prices rose unchecked hitting the poor worst of all.
unfettered	Not bound by shackles and chains. Unfettered artistic genius.
unformed	Not having form or shape. An as yet unformed government.
unlimited	Having no limits in range or scope. Offshore reserves of gas and oil are not unlimited .
unrestricted	Not subject to or subjected to restriction. Unrestricted verbs are usually stronger than those qualified by adverbs.
wild	A wild primitive state untouched by civilization. <i>He lived in the wild.</i>
