- haphazard** Marked by great carelessness.
A haphazard plan of action.
- heedless** Marked by or paying little heed or attention—Franklin D. Roosevelt.

*A **lackadaisical** spiritless young man about town.*

<u>lax</u>	Of a speech sound especially a vowel pronounced with the vocal muscles relaxed. <i>Lax in attending classes.</i>
<u>messy</u>	(of a situation) confused and difficult to deal with. <i>His messy hair.</i>
neglectful	Not giving proper care or attention to someone or something. <i>Neglectful of his duties.</i>
negligent	Characterized by neglect and undue lack of concern. <i>The council had been negligent in its supervision of the children in care.</i>
nonunionised	Not affiliated in a trade union.
nonunionized	Not affiliated in a trade union.
offhand	Casually thoughtless or inconsiderate. <i>She treated most men with offhand contempt.</i>
<u>remiss</u>	Lacking care or attention to duty; negligent. <i>Remiss of you not to pay your bills.</i>
slack	Not tense or taut. <i>They were working at a slack pace.</i>
slapdash	Done too hurriedly and carelessly. <i>He gave a slapdash performance.</i>
slovenly	(especially of a person or action) careless; excessively casual. <i>Slovenly speech.</i>
<u>thoughtless</u>	Showing lack of careful thought. <i>It was thoughtless of her to have rushed out and not said where she would be going.</i>
unmethodical	Not efficient or methodical. <i>His inability to locate the source of the trouble resulted in unmethodical chaos.</i>
unorganised	Not affiliated in a trade union.
unsystematic	Not done or acting according to a fixed plan or system; unmethodical. <i>He works in an unsystematic manner.</i>
untidy	Not neat and tidy. <i>Untidy and casual about money.</i>

individual	Separate and distinct from others of the same kind. <i>Mark the individual pages.</i>
<u>initiative</u>	An act or strategy intended to resolve a difficulty or improve a situation; a fresh approach to something. <i>Anti hunting groups have seized the initiative in the dispute.</i>
irrespective	Not taking (something) into account; regardless of. <i>Child benefit is paid irrespective of income levels.</i>
nationalist	Relating to nationalists or nationalism. <i>Minor nationalistic differences.</i>
<u>secede</u>	Withdraw from an organization or communion. <i>The kingdom of Belgium seceded from the Netherlands in 1830.</i>
separatist	Relating to separatists or separatism. <i>Religious separatists.</i>
unaided	Carried out without aid or assistance. <i>His first unaided walk through the park.</i>
<u>unbridled</u>	Uncontrolled; unconstrained. <i>Unbridled lust.</i>
<u>unchecked</u>	Not restrained or controlled. <i>Prices rose unchecked hitting the poor worst of all.</i>
unfettered	Not bound by shackles and chains. <i>Unfettered artistic genius.</i>
unformed	Not having form or shape. <i>An as yet unformed government.</i>
unlimited	Having no limits in range or scope. <i>Offshore reserves of gas and oil are not unlimited.</i>
unrestricted	Not subject to or subjected to restriction. <i>Unrestricted verbs are usually stronger than those qualified by adverbs.</i>
wild	A wild primitive state untouched by civilization. <i>He lived in the wild.</i>
<u>yet</u>	Used after a superlative. <i>The largest drug bust yet.</i>
