lackadaisical Idle or indolent especially in a dreamy way- P.G.Wodehouse.

A lackadaisical spiritless young man about town.

last-minute Just before a deadline at the last minute.



Of a speech sound especially a vowel pronounced with the vocal muscles

<u>lax</u> relaxed.

Lax in attending classes.

(of a situation) confused and difficult to deal with.

messy His messy hair.

neglectful Not giving proper care or attention to someone or something.

Neglectful of his duties.

Characterized by neglect and undue lack of concern.

negligentThe council had been **negligent** in its supervision of the children in care.

nonunionised Not affiliated in a trade union. **nonunionized** Not affiliated in a trade union.

offhand Casually thoughtless or inconsiderate.

She treated most men with offhand contempt.

remiss Lacking care or attention to duty; negligent.

Remiss of you not to pay your bills.

Not tense or taut.

slack

They were working at a slack pace.

Done too hurriedly and carelessly.

slapdash

He gave a slapdash performance.

slovenly (especially of a person or action) careless; excessively casual.

Slovenly speech.

Showing lack of careful thought.

thoughtless It was **thoughtless** of her to have rushed out and not said where she would

be going.

Not efficient or methodical.

unmethodical His inability to locate the source of the trouble resulted in unmethodical

chaos.

unorganised Not affiliated in a trade union.

unsystematic Not done or acting according to a fixed plan or system; unmethodical.

He works in an **unsystematic** manner.

Not neat and tidy.

untidy Untidy and casual about money.
