attache	A specialist assigned to the staff of a diplomatic mission.
backpack	Hike with a backpack. <i>He went to the trunk and pulled out a two tank scuba backpack.</i>
bag	Put into a bag. <i>She began to unpack her bags.</i>
belongings	A person's movable possessions. <i>She didn't have much baggage with her as most of her belongings had been sent ahead by sea.</i>
burden	The refrain or chorus of a song. <i>The burden of establishing that the authority had misused its powers rests upon the prosecution.</i>
carousel	A merry-go-round at a fair. <i>They were waiting for their bags to appear on the carousel.</i>
carrousel	A conveyer belt that carries luggage to be claimed by air travelers.
case	A set of facts or arguments supporting one side in a legal case. <i>200 000 cases of hepatitis B.</i>
checkbook	A book issued to holders of checking accounts.
crate	Pack something in a crate for transportation. <i>You wouldn't believe the age of some of the crates I've driven.</i>
dollar	A United States coin worth one dollar. <i>He worships the almighty dollar.</i>
have	Have ownership or possession of. <i>Have a feeling.</i>
holder	A smallholder. <i>I replaced the phone in its holder.</i>
knapsack	A bag carried by a strap on your back or shoulder.

load	Place a load or large quantity of something on or in a vehicle ship container etc. <i>He loaded his gun carefully.</i>
lose	Miss from one's possessions lose sight of. <i>Lose that creep.</i>
lug	Carry or drag (a heavy or bulky object) with great effort. <i>You'll have to lug this suitcase.</i>
luggage	Cases used to carry belongings when traveling. <i>Carrying emotional luggage from the past.</i>
mislay	Place (something) where one cannot find it again. <i>I seem to have mislaid my car keys.</i>
misplace	Position incorrectly. <i>I misplaced my eyeglasses.</i>
pack	Seal with packing. <i>He packs a gun and keeps it at the ready.</i>
packet	Make up into or wrap up in a packet. <i>I can eat a whole packet of biscuits in one go.</i>
packing	The action or process of packing something. <i>The backpacking of oxygen is essential for astronauts.</i>
paperback	Having a flexible binding. <i>The shelves were stacked with well thumbed paperbacks.</i>
pocket	Drive a ball into a pocket. <i>Local politicians were found to have been pocketing the proceeds of fund raisers.</i>
purse	A sum of money spoken of as the contents of a money purse. <i>Purse ones lips.</i>
stow	Pack or store (an object) carefully and neatly in a particular place. <i>Stow the cart.</i>
stuff	Fill with a stuffing while cooking. <i>Chicken stuffed with mushrooms and breadcrumbs.</i>
suitcase	A portable rectangular container for carrying clothes. <i>Three huge suitcases and a plethora of hand baggage.</i>
wallet	A pocket-sized flat folding case for holding money and plastic cards.
