<u>phenomenal</u>	Remarkable or exceptional, especially exceptionally good. <i>The phenomenal world.</i>
preeminence	High status importance owing to marked superiority.
splendid	Very good; of the highest quality. <i>A splendid fellow.</i>
<u>super</u>	A superintendent. <i>A super quality binder.</i>
superb	Used in names of birds with attractive or colourful plumage e.g. superb lyrebird. <i>A superb actor.</i>
superlative	A superlative adjective or adverb. <i>The critics ran out of superlatives to describe him.</i>
supreme	A dish served in a supreme sauce. <i>The supreme confidence of youth.</i>
surpassing	Exceeding or surpassing usual limits especially in excellence. <i>A picture of surpassing beauty.</i>
terrific	Extremely good; excellent. <i>It's been such a terrific day.</i>
unequaled	Radically distinctive and without equal. <i>Craftsmen whose skill is unequaled.</i>
unexampled	Having no previous example or precedent or parallel. <i>A time of unexampled prosperity.</i>
<u>unmatched</u>	Of the remaining member of a pair, of socks e.g. <i>Infamy unmatched in the Western world.</i>
unpaired	Of the remaining member of a pair, of socks e.g. <i>Unpaired socks.</i>
unprecedented	Never done or known before. <i>An unprecedented expansion in population and industry.</i>
