<b>unprecedented</b>	Having no precedent; novel. <i>An <b>unprecedented</b> expansion in population and industry.</i>
<b>without equal</b>	Having the requisite qualities or resources to meet a task.
<b>without parallel</b>	Of or relating to the simultaneous performance of multiple operations.

<b>apotheosis</b>	Model of excellence or perfection of a kind; one having no equal. <i>Death spared Pompey the task of having to account for the <b>apotheosis</b> of Caesar.</i>
<b>awesome</b>	Extremely impressive or daunting; inspiring awe. <i>My yearly review went <b>awesome</b>.</i>
<b>best</b>	(comparative and superlative of `well') wiser or more advantageous and hence advisable. <i>This is jazz at its <b>best</b>.</i>
<b>better</b>	Comparative of good changed for the better in health or fitness. <i>Produced a <b>better</b> mousetrap.</i>
<b>deftness</b>	Skillful performance or ability without difficulty.
<b>excellent</b>	Extremely good; outstanding. <i>Made an <b>excellent</b> speech.</i>
<b>exceptional</b>	Surpassing what is common or usual or expected. <i><b>Exceptional</b> kindness.</i>
<b>incomparable</b>	Such that comparison is impossible; unsuitable for comparison or lacking features that can be compared. <i>Censorship still exists but now it s <b>incomparable</b> with what it was.</i>

<b>matchless</b>	So good as to be unequalled; incomparable. <i>Matchless</i> beauty.
<b>nonpareil</b>	A flat disk of chocolate covered with beads of colored sugar. <i>The team's nonpareil center fielder.</i>
<b>outstanding</b>	Having a quality that thrusts itself into attention. <i>Works of outstanding banality.</i>
<b>peerless</b>	Eminent beyond or above comparison. <i>A peerless scholar.</i>
<b><u>phenomenal</u></b>	Remarkable or exceptional, especially exceptionally good. <i>The phenomenal world.</i>
<b>preeminence</b>	High status importance owing to marked superiority.
<b>splendid</b>	Very good; of the highest quality. <i>A splendid fellow.</i>
<b><u>super</u></b>	A superintendent. <i>A super quality binder.</i>
<b>superb</b>	Used in names of birds with attractive or colourful plumage e.g. superb lyrebird. <i>A superb actor.</i>
<b>superlative</b>	A superlative adjective or adverb. <i>The critics ran out of superlatives to describe him.</i>
<b>supreme</b>	A dish served in a supreme sauce. <i>The supreme confidence of youth.</i>
<b>surpassing</b>	Exceeding or surpassing usual limits especially in excellence. <i>A picture of surpassing beauty.</i>
<b>terrific</b>	Extremely good; excellent. <i>It's been such a terrific day.</i>
<b>unequaled</b>	Radically distinctive and without equal. <i>Craftsmen whose skill is unequaled.</i>
<b>unexampled</b>	Having no previous example or precedent or parallel. <i>A time of unexampled prosperity.</i>
<b><u>unmatched</u></b>	Of the remaining member of a pair, of socks e.g. <i>Infamy unmatched in the Western world.</i>
<b>unpaired</b>	Of the remaining member of a pair, of socks e.g. <i>Unpaired socks.</i>
<b>unprecedented</b>	Never done or known before. <i>An unprecedented expansion in population and industry.</i>

- unrivaled** Eminent beyond or above comparison.  
***Unrivaled** mastery of her art.*
- vantage** Place or situation affording some advantage especially a comprehensive view or commanding perspective.  
*From my **vantage** point I could see into the front garden.*
- wonderful** Extraordinarily good or great ; used especially as intensifiers.  
*The climate was **wonderful** all the year round.*
