## Unpopular as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Unpopular" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “unpopular” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Not liked or popular.*
- *Regarded with disfavor or lacking general approval.*

### Synonyms of "Unpopular" as an adjective (6 Words)

<b>despised</b>	Treated with dislike or contempt.
<b>detested</b>	Treated with dislike or contempt.
<b>disliked</b>	Regarded with aversion. <i>He was intensely <b>disliked</b>.</i>
<b>friendless</b>	Having no friends; alone. <i>They have been left virtually <b>friendless</b>.</i>
<b>hated</b>	Treated with dislike or contempt.
<b>unloved</b>	Not loved. <i>Melanie felt lonely and <b>unloved</b>.</i>

<b>anonymous</b>	(of a person) not identified by name; of unknown name. <i>His impeccable slightly <b>anonymous</b> Chelsea flat.</i>
<b>classic</b>	An artist who has created classic works. <i>His books have become <b>classics</b>.</i>
<b>contest</b>	An occasion on which a winner is selected from among two or more contestants. <i>They <b>contested</b> the outcome of the race.</i>
<b>copy</b>	Send someone a copy of an email that is addressed to a third party. <i>The students were made to <b>copy</b> the alphabet over and over.</i>
<b>epitomize</b>	Be a perfect example of. <i>The company <b>epitomized</b> the problems faced by British industry.</i>
<b>excellent</b>	Very good; of the highest quality. <i>Made an <b>excellent</b> speech.</i>
<b>exemplary</b>	(of damages) exceeding the amount needed for simple compensation. <i>Her works are <b>exemplary</b> of certain feminist arguments.</i>
<b>extremely</b>	To a very great degree; very. <i><b>Extremely</b> interesting.</i>
<b>formulaic</b>	Constituting or containing a set form of words. <i><b>Formulaic</b> expressions such as <i>Once upon a time</i>.</i>
<b>internet</b>	A global computer network providing a variety of information and communication facilities, consisting of interconnected networks using standardized communication protocols. <i>The guide is also available on the <b>internet</b>.</i>
<b>involuntary</b>	Done without will or conscious control. <i><b>Involuntary</b> manslaughter.</i>
<b>likewise</b>	In a like manner; similarly. <i>The programmes of study will apply from five years of age <b>likewise</b> the attainment targets.</i>

<b><u>mainstream</u></b>	Belonging to or characteristic of the mainstream. <i>His thinking was in the American <b>mainstream</b>.</i>
<b>model</b>	Create a representation or model of. <i>A well known fashion <b>model</b>.</i>
<b>nameless</b>	(of a child) illegitimate. <i>Some pictures were taken by a <b>nameless</b> photographer.</i>
<b>ordinary</b>	(especially of a judge or bishop) exercising authority by virtue of office and not by deputation. <i>He sets out to depict <b>ordinary</b> people.</i>
<b><u>overseer</u></b>	A person who supervises others, especially workers.
<b>politically</b>	With regard to social relationships involving authority. <i>Southeast Asia is divided <b>politically</b> into a number of nation states.</i>
<b>popular</b>	(of political activity) carried on by the people as a whole rather than restricted to politicians or political parties. <i>A democratic or <b>popular</b> movement.</i>
<b>popularity</b>	The quality of being widely admired or accepted or sought after. <i>The universal <b>popularity</b> of American movies.</i>
<b><u>pseudonym</u></b>	A fictitious name, especially one used by an author. <i>I wrote under the <b>pseudonym</b> of Evelyn Hervey.</i>
<b><u>scribe</u></b>	A person who copies out documents, especially one employed to do this before printing was invented. <i>Mark the position of the lock body on the door edge then <b>scribe</b> a centre mark.</i>
<b><u>simplistic</u></b>	Treating complex issues and problems as if they were much simpler than they really are. <i>A <b>simplistic</b> theory of the universe.</i>
<b><u>typical</u></b>	Characteristic of a particular person or thing. <i>A <b>typical</b> suburban community.</i>
<b>unidentified</b>	Not yet identified. <i>A picture of an <b>unidentified</b> motorcyclist.</i>
<b><u>unintentional</u></b>	Done or made or performed with purpose and intent. <i>The offense was <b>unintentional</b>.</i>
<b><u>unintentionally</u></b>	Not on purpose. <i><b>Unintentionally</b> rude song lyrics.</i>
<b>unknown</b>	An unknown and unexplored region. <i>An <b>unknown</b> island.</i>

**whereabouts**

Where or approximately where.
