inconstant Frequently changing; variable or irregular.

Inconstant affections.

Lacking continuity or regularity.

Highly **irregular** behavior.

mercurial Of or containing the element mercury.

Gels containing organic **mercurial** compounds.

Giving an impression of melancholy or mystery.

moody

He sat in moody silence.

random Governed by or involving equal chances for each item.

Are you going to take some **random** guy on Twitter s word.

temperamental (of a person) liable to unreasonable changes of mood.

They were firm friends in spite of **temperamental** differences.

Subject to change.

Everything is **uncertain** about the army.



undependable Not worthy of reliance or trust.

Evidence is scarce and often **undependable**.

unforeseeable Incapable of being anticipated.

Unforeseeable consequences.

unmanageable Difficult or impossible to manage, manipulate, or control.

His behaviour was becoming **unmanageable** at home.

unreliable Dangerously unstable and unpredictable.

Unreliable information.

unstable Likely to give way; not stable.

His rather **unstable** religious convictions.

unsure Lacking self-confidence.

She was feeling nervous **unsure** of herself.

up in the air Getting higher or more vigorous.

variable (of a quantity) able to assume different numerical values.

Awards can be for variable amounts.

volatile (of a person) liable to display rapid changes of emotion.

A **volatile** situation with troops and rioters eager for a confrontation.

Determined by chance or impulse or whim rather than by necessity or

whimsical reason.

The victim of **whimsical** persecutions.

fickle Changing frequently, especially as regards one's loyalties or affections.

A change of momentum produced by an impulse equivalent to the average

impulsive Characterized by undue haste and lack of thought or deliberation.

inconstant Frequently changing; variable or irregular.

infrequent Not occurring often; rare.

Not firm or firmly fixed; likely to fail or give way.

A financially **insecure** period.
