- Not willing to do something.
- Not made ready for use.

## Synonyms of "Unprepared" as an adjective (14 Words)

| averse      | Having a strong dislike of or opposition to something.<br>As a former CIA director he is not <b>averse</b> to secrecy. |
|-------------|--|
| disinclined | Unwilling because of mild dislike or disapproval. <b>Disinclined</b> to say anything to anybody.                       |
| indisposed  | Slightly unwell.<br>The potential audience seemed <b>indisposed</b> to attend.   |
| loath       | (usually followed by `to') strongly opposed.<br><i>Loath</i> to admit a mistake.                                       |



| not ready  | Apprehending and responding with speed and sensitivity.  |

| off guard  | Not in operation or operational.   |
| off one's guard Not in operation or operational. |  |
| opposed  | Being in opposition or having an opponent.<br>The agency is being asked to do two diametrically <b>opposed</b> things.   |
| reluctant  | Not eager.<br>Foreigners stubbornly <b>reluctant</b> to accept our ways.   |
| <u>resistant</u>                                 | Denoting starch that is not easily broken down by enzymes within the<br>body and is therefore minimally absorbed during digestion.<br>Cooked rice like bread contains a useful amount of <b>resistant</b> starch<br>which acts like fibre in the digestive system. |
| surprised  | Taken unawares or suddenly and feeling wonder or astonishment. <i>Surprised</i> that he remembered my name.  |
| unready  | Slow to act; hesitant.<br>She was young and <b>unready</b> for motherhood.   |
| unsuspecting                                     | <ul> <li>(of a person or animal) not aware of the presence of danger; feeling no suspicion.</li> <li>Unsuspecting or unaware of the fact that I would one day be their leader.</li> </ul>  |
| <u>unwilling</u>                                 | Not ready, eager, or prepared to do something.<br><i>Unwilling</i> conscripts.   |
