- *Not willing to do something.*
- Not made ready for use.

Synonyms of "Unprepared" as an adjective (14 Words)

averse Having a strong dislike of or opposition to something.

As a former CIA director he is not **averse** to secrecy.

disinclined Unwilling because of mild dislike or disapproval.

Disinclined to say anything to anybody.

indisposed Slightly unwell.

loath

The potential audience seemed **indisposed** to attend.

(usually followed by `to') strongly opposed.

Loath to admit a mistake.



not ready Apprehending and responding with speed and sensitivity.

off guard Not in operation or operational.off one's guard Not in operation or operational.

opposedBeing in opposition or having an opponent.

The agency is being asked to do two diametrically **opposed** things.

reluctant Not eager.

Foreigners stubbornly **reluctant** to accept our ways.

Denoting starch that is not easily broken down by enzymes within the

body and is therefore minimally absorbed during digestion.

resistant
Cooked rice like bread contains a useful amount of resistant starch

which acts like fibre in the digestive system.

surprisedTaken unawares or suddenly and feeling wonder or astonishment.

Surprised that he remembered my name.

Slow to act; hesitant.

She was young and unready for motherhood.

(of a person or animal) not aware of the presence of danger; feeling no

suspicion.

unsuspectingUnsuspecting or unaware of the fact that I would one day be their

leader.

Not ready, eager, or prepared to do something.

unwilling Unwilling conscripts.
