Likely to be affected by something.

suppositional Based primarily on surmise rather than adequate evidence.

Concerned primarily with theories or hypotheses rather than

theoretical

practical considerations. *A theoretical* physicist.

unconfirmed Not confirmed as to truth or validity.

An **unconfirmed** report of shots being fired.

Not proved.

unproved

Unproved assumptions.

Still in doubt.

unsettled They charge interest on debts that remain **unsettled** after 30

days.
