

Definitions of "Unproven" as an adjective

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "unproven" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Not proved.
- (of a new method, system, or treatment) not tried and tested.
- Not demonstrated by evidence or argument to be true or existing.





Synonyms of "Unproven" as an adjective (15 Words)

<u>abstract</u>	Dealing with a subject in the abstract without practical purpose or intention. Abstract concepts such as love or beauty.
academic	(of a person) interested in or excelling at scholarly pursuits and activities. <i>Academic</i> achievement.
hypothetical	Denoting or containing a proposition of the logical form if p then q. <i>Let us take a hypothetical case.</i>
indefinite	Not decided or not known. Amorphous blots of color having vague and indefinite edges.
notional	(in language teaching) denoting or relating to a syllabus that aims to develop communicative competence. <i>To create a notional world for oneself.</i>



<u>preliminary</u>	Denoting an action or event preceding or in preparation for something more important. <i>The discussions were seen as preliminary to the policy paper.</i>
provisional	(of a postage stamp) put into circulation temporarily, usually owing to the unavailability of the definitive issue. A provisional government.
putative	Purported; commonly put forth or accepted as true on inconclusive grounds. The putative author of the book.
speculative	(of a business venture) undertaken on the chance of success, without a pre-existing contract. <i>Raised a speculative eyebrow.</i>
subject to confirmation	Likely to be affected by something.
suppositional	Based primarily on surmise rather than adequate evidence.
theoretical	Concerned primarily with theories or hypotheses rather than practical considerations. A theoretical physicist.
unconfirmed	Not confirmed as to truth or validity. An unconfirmed report of shots being fired.
unproved	Not proved. Unproved assumptions.
unsettled	Still in doubt. They charge interest on debts that remain unsettled after 30 days.
