- *Not identified from previous encounters or knowledge.*
- *Not acknowledged as valuable or valid.*



## Synonyms of "Unrecognized" as an adjective (33 Words)

<b>anonymous</b>	(of a person) not identified by name; of unknown name. <i>Brown <b>anonymous</b> houses.</i>
<b><u>buried</u></b>	Placed in a grave. <i>The hastily <b>buried</b> corpses.</i>
<b>bygone</b>	Well in the past; former. <i>Relics of a <b>bygone</b> age.</i>
<b>forgotten</b>	Not noticed inadvertently. <i>He was scolded for his <b>forgotten</b> chores.</i>
<b><u>gone</u></b>	Well in the past; former. <i>She sat half <b>gone</b> on a folding chair.</i>
<b>gone clean out of someone's mind</b>	Dead.
<b>humble</b>	Used of unskilled work (especially domestic work). <i>I felt very <b>humble</b> when meeting her.</i>
<b><u>inconsequential</u></b>	Lacking worth or importance. <i>His work seems trivial and <b>inconsequential</b>.</i>
<b><u>inconspicuous</u></b>	Not clearly visible or attracting attention. <i>He pushed the string through an <b>inconspicuous</b> hole.</i>
<b>inglorious</b>	Deserving or bringing disgrace or shame- Rachel Carson. <i><b>Inglorious</b> though the peasants may have been this is not synonymous with mute.</i>
<b><u>insignificant</u></b>	(of a person) without power or influence. <i><b>Insignificant</b> sounds.</i>
<b>irrecoverable</b>	Not able to be recovered, regained, or remedied. <i>His liquid assets had to be written off as <b>irrecoverable</b>.</i>
<b>irretrievable</b>	Not able to be retrieved or put right. <i>The <b>irretrievable</b> breakdown of their marriage.</i>
<b>left behind</b>	Being or located on or directed toward the side of the body to the west when facing north.
<b>little known</b>	Faint.
<b>lost</b>	Having lost your bearings confused as to time or place or personal identity. <i>She stood there clutching a drink feeling completely <b>lost</b>.</i>
<b><u>lowly</u></b>	(of an organism) primitive or simple. <i>A <b>lowly</b> parish priest.</i>

<b><u>minor</u></b>	Of a key or mode based on a minor scale and tending to produce a sad or pensive effect. <i>A <b>minor</b> poet.</i>
<b>nameless</b>	(of a child) illegitimate. <i>The director of an organization which shall remain <b>nameless</b>.</i>
<b>obliterated</b>	Reduced to nothingness.
<b>out of mind</b>	Out of power; especially having been unsuccessful in an election.
<b>past</b>	Earlier than the present time; no longer current. <i>The <b>past</b> year.</i>
<b>past recall</b>	Of a person who has held and relinquished a position or office.
<b>past recollection</b>	Of a person who has held and relinquished a position or office.
<b>undistinguished</b>	Not worthy of notice. <i>An <b>undistinguished</b> career.</i>
<b>unhonoured</b>	Not given public praise or respect. <i>His first rate performances were largely <b>unhonoured</b>.</i>
<b><u>unimportant</u></b>	Lacking in importance or significance. <i>Trivial and <b>unimportant</b> details.</i>
<b>unknown</b>	Being or having an unknown or unnamed source. <i>An <b>unknown</b> source.</i>
<b><u>unnoticed</u></b>	Not noticed. <i>A deliberate kick that went <b>unnoticed</b> by the referee.</i>
<b>unrecognised</b>	Not recognized.
<b>unremembered</b>	Not remembered; forgotten. <i>They lived according to social codes now utterly <b>unremembered</b>.</i>
<b>unrenowned</b>	Not renowned.
<b>unsung</b>	Not famous or acclaimed. <i>Harvey is one of the <b>unsung</b> heroes of the industrial revolution.</i>
