implacable	Unable to be stopped; relentless. <i>He was an implacable enemy of Ted s.</i>
incessant	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The incessant beat of the music.</i>
inexorable	Impossible to stop or prevent. <i>The seemingly inexorable march of new technology.</i>
inflexible	Not able to be bent; stiff. <i>An inflexible law.</i>
perpetual	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>A perpetual secretary of the society.</i>
persistent	Never-ceasing. <i>Persistent leaves remain attached past maturity.</i>
<u>relentless</u>	Unceasingly intense. <i>A patient but relentless taskmaster.</i>
<u>resolute</u>	Admirably purposeful, determined, and unwavering. <i>He was resolute in his fight to uphold liberal values.</i>
sedulous	Marked by care and persistent effort. <i>Sedulous pursuit of legal and moral principles.</i>
<u>steady</u>	(of a person) sensible, reliable, and self-restrained. <i>He refilled her glass with a steady hand.</i>
stern	Of a stern or strict bearing or demeanor forbidding in aspect. <i>A smile transformed his stern face.</i>
sustained	Continuous. <i>Several years of sustained economic growth.</i>
<u>tireless</u>	Characterized by hard work and perseverance. <i>A tireless campaigner.</i>
unabating	Not weakening or losing intensity. <i>Unabating enthusiasm.</i>
unappeasable	Not to be placated or appeased or moved by entreaty. <i>What began as an aspiration turned soon to an unappeasable hunger.</i>
unbending	Reserved, formal, or strict in one's behaviour or attitudes; austere and inflexible. <i>An unbending will to dominate.</i>
<u>unbroken</u>	Not subdued or trained for service or use. <i>Fortunately the other lens is unbroken.</i>

unceasing	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>Man s unceasing warfare with drought and isolation.</i>
<u>uncompromising</u>	Showing an unwillingness to make concessions to others, especially by changing one's ways or opinions. <i>The uncompromising ugliness of the era s buildings.</i>
<u>unending</u>	Having or seeming to have no end. <i>The unending bliss of heaven.</i>
unflagging	Showing sustained enthusiastic action with unflagging vitality. <i>Unflagging courtesy.</i>
<u>unforgiving</u>	(of a place or situation) harsh or hostile. <i>He was always a proud and unforgiving man.</i>
unrelieved	Lacking variation or change; monotonous. <i>Flowing gowns of unrelieved black.</i>
<u>unremitting</u>	Never relaxing or slackening; incessant. <i>Unremitting demands of hunger.</i>
<u>unshakeable</u>	Marked by firm determination or resolution; not shakable. <i>My unshakeable faith in the goodness of mankind.</i>
<u>unstoppable</u>	Impossible to stop or prevent. <i>As unstoppable as the wind.</i>
unswerving	Not changing or becoming weaker; steady or constant. <i>Unswerving loyalty.</i>
<u>unwavering</u>	Not showing abrupt variations- Louis Auchincloss. <i>She fixed him with an unwavering stare.</i>
unyielding	Stubbornly unyielding T S Eliot. <i>The Atlantic hurled its waves at the unyielding rocks.</i>

headstrong	Habitually disposed to disobedience and opposition. <i>The headstrong impulsiveness of youth.</i>
implacable	Unable to be appeased or placated. <i>An implacable enemy.</i>
incessant	(of something regarded as unpleasant) continuing without pause or interruption. <i>The incessant beat of the music.</i>
incessantly	Without interruption. <i>She talked about him incessantly.</i>
inexorable	(of a person) impossible to persuade; unrelenting. <i>The seemingly inexorable march of new technology.</i>
merciless	Having or showing no mercy. <i>A merciless critic.</i>
obduracy	Resoluteness by virtue of being unyielding and inflexible.
obdurate	Stubbornly refusing to change one's opinion or course of action. <i>The child's misery would move even the most obdurate heart.</i>
obsessive	Characterized by or constituting an obsession. <i>People dogged by obsessive jealousy.</i>
persistent	Continuing to exist or occur over a prolonged period. <i>Persistent leaves remain attached past maturity.</i>
pertinacious	Stubbornly unyielding. <i>He worked with a pertinacious resistance to interruptions.</i>
relentless	Never-ceasing. <i>A patient but relentless taskmaster.</i>
steadfast	Firm and dependable especially in loyalty. <i>Steadfast resolve.</i>
steady	Make or become steady. <i>Held the ladder steady.</i>

stubborn	Having or showing dogged determination not to change one's attitude or position on something, especially in spite of good arguments or reasons to do so. <i>A stubborn infection.</i>
stubbornly	In a way that is difficult to move, remove, or improve. <i>She remained stubbornly in the same position.</i>
tenacious	Sticking together. <i>Tenacious memory.</i>
termagant	A harsh-tempered or overbearing woman.
unceasingly	With unflagging resolve.
